President's Point of View

Busy Keeping Kimberly A Great Place to Live, Learn, Work and Play

As we go about life here in this great community, I think that many of us take for granted what happens in keeping the village the gem of a community that it is. As I pondered that thought myself, I thought sharing some facts with everyone may heighten the sense of appreciation....

Before I get too "facy" I would like to acknowledge some great efforts over the summer from The Amphitheater Team who hosted Sunday evening affairs, the Community Band who provided toe-tapping enjoyment, The Library staff that offered a wealth of learning opportunities and fun through their programming, to the KRA in hosting a huge youth state softball tournament without a glitch. The American Legion for preparing a Memorial Day program that helped remind us of the REALLY important things, and to the Paperfest Committee who once again brought entertainment to Sunset Park and provided opportunity for organizations to fundraise as thousands flocked to the venue for hours of relaxation and escape from the hustle and bustle that is life these days. Also, thanks to all who have endured street/sewer projects. The dusty, noisy process is an inconvenience and expense and we appreciate your cooperation as we try diligently to maintain the infrastructure throughout the community.

Now some information to share on YOUR village. Our village is proud of the 104 acres of park land which includes 9 shelters, 5 ball diamonds, 4 soccer fields and 45 separate pieces of play equipment. A new Kayak launch is being used more than many of us would have anticipated and our newly renovated boat launch is safe and attractive. Alongside is a full access fishing pier and picnic areas with tranquil river views. If water is your thing, our sandy beach swim facility remains the envy of the Fox Cities. An average day saw more than 300 people taking a cool dip or some castle

building along the shores. This summer 13 separate recreation programs served 550 participants keeping balance with learning team play, staying active and having a chance to simply "be a kid!" The bigger kids were often seen enjoying more than 2 miles of paved trails within our parks.

The street crew was busy maintaining 550 miles of streets and curbing. 105 TONS of debris has been swept as the street cleaner machine is guided along our roadways this year! 47 TONS of yard waste has been collected in addition to 1,670 TONS of garbage and 560 TONS of recyclables! Twelve times in the winter of 2015, crews were called in to clear snow from our roadways and nine times we applied salt to keep travel safe. The crew continued to recover from the tornadoes of two years ago as they fell, grubbed, and stumped out 98 trees throughout the village and replanted 175!!

When I look at the facts of what happens I am grateful to those who take pride in maintaining our village, in providing opportunities for all to enjoy a positive quality of life experience here in Kimberly. I find it interesting that when I was looking at snow plow calls, how different one year can be. This year with nine call in plows was relatively light compared to 2014. That in itself is interesting to me, but when I look at the fact that we spent 7 weeks engaged in leaf pickup, I wondered out loud whether I should pray for earlier snow!---- Makes me wonder about 175 new trees!

We are a lucky and grateful community. Thanks to each of you who continue to work in harmony in keeping Kimberly a great place to live, learn, work and play!

Kimberly Water Department Customers Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. beginning October 5th through October 15th. The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.

Holiday Schedule

All Village offices and departments will be closed **Monday, September 7th** in observance of **Labor Day**.

Holiday does **NOT** affect weekly pick up of garbage or recycling.

STREET DEPARTMENT

LEAF PICKUP

Leaf pick up will begin around the second week in October and continue through November 20th, weather permitting. Place all leaves on the terrace for pickup.

- Rake leaves to the terrace, NOT INTO THE STREET.
- DO NOT put leaves in bags, leaves which are placed in bags or any container WILL NOT be picked up.
- DO NOT rake twigs or branches with the leaves. They will clog the vacuum.
- Please keep plastic and paper out of piles.

Please keep in mind when leaf pickup begins the volume of leaves are minimal which means you may see the trucks canvas the town more often. Later when all the trees drop the leaves, usually overnight, the volume of leaves slows down pick up times and the trucks take longer to get through the Village. When leaf pick up is at its prime you may only get picked up once in a two week period and once the truck has been down your street at may take that long to return.



MORE LEAVES – MORE TIME it's that simple.

It's Worth Repeating!

ARE YOU IN VIOLATION OF ORDINANCE 418-6B?

TIME OF PLACEMENT FOR COLLECTION OF REFUSE

Many residents are in violation of placing large items or the polycart to the curb too soon or not removing the polycart from the terrace after pick up.

THE ORDINANCE READS AS FOLLOWS:

Restriction on time of placement. All polycart containers for refuse and large item waste shall be placed in collection locations by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection, but not before 5:00 p.m. on the evenings prior to the regular collection time. All polycart containers for refuse and garbage disposal shall be removed from the curbside collection point within 24 hours after the regular collection time.

FREE FALL YARD WASTE

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free fall yard waste pick up ONLY on the following day:

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20TH

for residents with a TUESDAY garbage collection

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23RD

For residents with a FRIDAY garbage collection

Yard waste consisting of garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18" in length) will be picked up. Yard Waste must be put in brown paper lawn and yard waste bags and not exceed 50lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the FREE fall yard waste pick up

Once a street has been picked up, they WILL NOT return! Yard waste will be picked up on your refuse collection day ONLY.

NO GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES OR PLASTIC BAGS!

BRUSH PICKUP

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter must be called in by 4:00 p.m. on WEDNESDAY for a Thursday pickup.

FREE TIRE PICK UP

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free tire pick up ONLY on the following day:

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22ND

for residents with a Tuesday garbage collection

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25TH

for residents with a Friday garbage collection.



This free tire pick up has been authorized by Outagamie County and the Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, and tires cannot be larger than 17" passenger vehicle tires. (NO business generated tires)
