President's POINT OF VIEW

STREET DEPARTMENT

SPRING YARD WASTE CLEAN UP

Yard Waste will be picked up on **April 14th and April 28th**, for residents with Tuesday garbage collection and **April 17th and May 1st** for residents with Friday garbage collection. Garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18") in length will be picked up. Material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS** and not to exceed 50 lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the spring yard waste clean up.

No Grass Clippings to include thatching your lawn!

The Village also picks up yard waste on the 3rd Friday of each month, from May through September. This material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS**, with a special sticker attached to each bag. Stickers and Brown Lawn and Yard Waste Bags are available at the Street Department and Village Clerk's Office, \$1.00 per sticker and \$.50 per bag.

Residents needing a yard waste pick-up must call the Street Department at 788-7507 and be placed on a list. All yard waste must be set out on the terrace by 6:00 AM.

Branches longer than 18" require a special pickup on Thursdays. Residents must call 788-7507 prior to 4:00 PM on Wednesday to schedule a Thursday brush pickup.

WHAT YOUR SUMP PUMP IS DOING FOR YOU

Spring is the most important time of the year to have a sump pump that works correctly. With the snow melting and the frost in the ground changing from ice to water, the ground around your home becomes saturated. Add the spring rains to the equation, and the foundation drain that surrounds a basement becomes very active. The water accumulating in this underground tube is directed into your sump pit. When full, the sump pump discharges the water to a storm water system (available in many neighborhoods) or to the lawn. This water eventually makes its way to the Fox River.

SANITARY SEWER INFORMATION

Any resident experiencing a Sanitary Sewer backup is requested to contact the Kimberly Street Department (788-7507) Monday thru Thursday 7:30 AM – 4:00 PM and Friday 7:30 AM - 3:00 PM or Fox Valley Metro Police Department (788-7505) evenings and weekends to report the backup.

When a backup is reported, the Village Street Crew will check the Village's sanitary sewer main line for possible blockage and report back to the residents with findings.

Any sewer blockage between the main and the residence is the responsibility of the home owner.

WARNING NOTICE

Per Village ordinance 430-10, it is unlawful to deposit snow or ice (from shoveling, snow blowing, or plowing) onto Village streets, alleys or sidewalks. Depositing snow onto Village right of way not only causes added expense for snow removal it also creates hazardous conditions while driving on our streets or walking on our sidewalks.

Each year, the public libraries of the Fox Cities and UW-Fox Valley come together with the goal of building a larger sense of community and to promote literacy through a program called **Fox Cities Reads**. We select an author and book title to promote, and we encourage the people in our communities to read the book and think, talk, listen, and grow together.



This year's Reads selection is entitled, **Orphan Train**, by Christina Baker Kline. **Orphan Train** delivers a captivating story of two very different women who build an unexpected friendship: a 91-year-old woman with a hidden past as an orphan-train rider and the teenage girl whose own troubled adolescence leads her to seek answers.

Between 1854 and 1929, so-called orphan trains ran regularly from the cities of the East Coast to the farmlands of the Midwest, carrying thousands of abandoned children whose fates would be determined by pure luck. Would they be adopted by a kind and loving family, or would they face a childhood and adolescence of hard labor and servitude? As a young Irish immigrant, Vivian Daly was one such child, sent by rail from New York City to an uncertain future a world away. Returning east later in life, Vivian leads a quiet, peaceful existence on the coast of Maine, the memories of her upbringing rendered a hazy blur. But in her attic, hidden in trunks, are vestiges of a turbulent past.

Seventeen-year-old Molly Ayer knows that a community-service position helping an elderly widow clean out her attic is the only thing keeping her out of juvenile hall. But as Molly helps Vivian sort through her keepsakes and possessions, she discovers that she and Vivian aren't as different as they appear. A Penobscot Indian who has spent her youth in and out of foster homes, Molly is also an outsider being raised by strangers, and she, too, has unanswered questions about the past.

Moving between contemporary Maine and Depression-era Minnesota, *Orphan Train* is a powerful tale of upheaval and resilience, second chances, and unexpected friendship.

We are thrilled that **Orphan Train** has been selected as the 2015 Fox Cities Reads and hope that people of all ages will read, talk, listen, and grow. Water Department Customers Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. **beginning April 6th through April 16th.** The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.**

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.



FIRE DEPARTMENT ACHIEVES ISO RATING OF 3

The Insurance Rating Organization (ISO) scores fire departments nation-wide based on a number of criteria including (but not limited to); equipment carried on vehicles, ability to pump large quantities of water, volume capabilities of village water systems, emergency response times, fire inspections etc. In 2014, the Kimberly Fire Department was audited and are proud to announce the Kimberly Fire Department achieved the ISO rating of 3, upgraded from a 4. The scale of rating is from 1 to 10 with an ISO rating of 1 being the very best and only a few fire departments in the country have the highest rating.

So what does ISO ratings mean to citizens and business? Nation-wide, Insurance companies base part of your home owner and business insurance premiums on local fire department insurance ratings, with the improvement to an ISO 3 rating, you may want to call your insurance carrier to see if the change in rating affects your own specific insurance coverage. Congratulations to the Village of Kimberly on achieving the ISO 3 rating, with special thanks to Administrator Hammett along with the Village Board, the Kimberly Water Department, and the Fire Fighters of Kimberly.

SMOKE DETECTORS COME FIRST

There is no safety item more important than smoke detectors! You need to make sure that you have working smoke detectors. While different smoke detector models deal with smoke and heat differently, there are some general rules about location.

1. You need at least one smoke detector on every level of the home and one outside every bedroom.
2. You should make sure that you test them once a month and change the batteries twice a year, if smoke detectors are "hard wired", but have battery backups, the batteries should also be changed twice per year. A good suggestion is very time we reset the clocks for daylight saving time, we also change the smoke detector batteries.

DON'T LET YOUR GUARD DOWN

Keep Matches/Lighters Out of Reach

Protect our children from the dangers of matches and lighters! One easy way is to keep matches and lighters out of the child's strike zone (area that the child is able to reach). Remember the old saying, "Out of sight, out of mind." If the matches are always kept where the child can't reach them, they will not be tempted to use, play, or experiment with them. Children should also be instructed to tell an adult if they see matches lying in the strike zone.

OPEN BURNING REMINDER

Spring will soon be here and everyone will be cleaning yards and trimming landscape. **IT IS AGAINST THE VILLAGE OPEN BURNING ORDINANCE TO BURN LEAVES, SHRUBS, AND TRIMMINGS.** Procedures for properly disposing of yard waste can be found on page 2 under Spring Yard Waste or by visiting the Village website @ www.vokimberly.org.



DOG LICENSES

The 2015 Dog Licenses are available at the Village Clerk's Office.

Neutered & Spayed Licenses \$ 7.00
Intact Male & Female Licenses \$ 12.00

WISCONSIN STATE LAW requires that dogs be licensed and rabies vaccinated by age 5 months. Licenses must be renewed each year by March 31st. By purchasing your licenses prior to March 31st you will avoid a \$5.00 late fee.

You must provide the current rabies vaccination information including date given, expiration date, manufacturer and serial number. If you obtained a dog license in 2014, but no longer own the dog, please call us at 788-7500 so that we can remove your information from our database. Thank you for your cooperation.

THIS NOTICE SERVES AS YOUR REMINDER TO OBTAIN A LICENSE. YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE ANOTHER NOTICE FROM OUR OFFICE. Owners of unlicensed dogs are subject to a \$114.00 fine.

Per village ordinance, your dog must be on a leash and you must pick up all animal feces.

As a reminder to anyone walking their dogs in Village of Kimberly parks, especially Sunset Park, dogs **MUST** be on a leash (per ordinance) and dogs **ARE NOT ALLOWED** on the baseball/softball/soccer fields at any time.
