## President's POINT OF VIEW

### Snowy Wisconsin greetings everyone...

I am hopeful this issue of Kim-Talk finds you warm and comfortable, plus looking forward to the first signs of spring. As I write this on January 15, the forecast calls for the mercury to plummet and while it is a balmy 31 degrees, I dread the sub-zero temperatures. I am working to convince myself that we are in the homestretch to springtime!

In these winter months our street department team is hard at it with maintaining safe, passable streets, tending to forestry needs, and gearing up for more winter activity. The library continues to offer some great programming that brings you inside where it is warm and has a cafeteria of topics that should interest nearly everyone. In the governance arena, the board continues to look forward with development, storm water management, election planning, and routine governance. Nothing glamorous, but always working to balance services that matter with costs that are reasonable; in short, kind of a routine winter time for the board as well.

I mentioned storm water, which reminds me of a question I was recently asked about the pending springtime construction of a pond at Memorial Park: "Why wouldn't we put it on the "mill site." A good question which deserves an explanation of the whys of storm water management. The Memorial Park site was the #3 site chosen through public input when we first discussed the new DNR requirements of storm water management. Sunset was #1 and Cortland #2; both being constructed and doing a fair share of removal of sediments before storm water eventually drains to the Fox River or Garners Creek. DNR regulations call for the village to continue removing more sediments and recent engineering calls for the need to construct up to eleven ponds within the village! I think a misconception is that Memorial Pond is being built to support the development of the "old mill" site. That is not accurate; in fact the Cedars development has requirements for construction of a pond on the north end of the development to address storm water directly from this development. The Memorial pond's construction allows for the removed soil to be

used for road building in the Cedars development but is not directly associated with storm water management for that parcel. I can tell you that the DNR requirements are ever changing and while certainly a good thing to keep the river clean, the challenges of finding cost effective sites to detain storm water continues to challenge communities around the state; and ours is no different. Stay tuned for more info as we continue working to remain compliant with DNR regulations.

In December the board had the pleasure to honor Al Schaefer with the Marie Ruys Citizenship Award. As many of you are keenly aware, Al is the consummate "community guy." Returning to his hometown with a skill set and unique ability to interact in a positive way with so many, Al has gone beyond the vision of what a Community Enrichment Director could bring to our village. Everywhere you turn, Al has fingerprints on the things that KEEP Kimberly a great place to live, learn, work, and play. Some of Al's work has been subtle; things like using the young people of our community to choose the right equipment for their neighborhood parks. Gaining that perspective and truly meeting the needs of those who will use the equipment is simply Al. Engaging with the KRA, KBO, KAYBC, Kimberly School District (where he coaches track), Senior Citizens, Amphitheater, Fox Cities Marathon, Fox Cities Convention and Visitor's Bureau—all natural fits for a team player who sees his work as helping others. Never one for the spotlight, Al was truly honored as what appeared to be an endless stream of family, colleagues, and community members filed into the board room to witness Al's receiving this award of excellence. Biggest crowd our council chamber has seen! -Thanks Al, you truly are the driving force in making Kimberly the great place it remains to Live, Learn, Work, and Play. Smile, Spring is on the horizon!

### ACCEPT

All Plastic Bottles & Containers:  
Soda, Water & Other Drink Bottles  
Food & Household Bottles, Jars and Jugs  
Dairy Containers & Lids  
Produce, Bakery & Deli Containers

### DO NOT ACCEPT

No Plastic Bags, Wrap or Film  
No Motor Oil Bottles  
No Styrofoam

### GUIDELINES:

Empty and rinse all bottles and containers  
Remove and discard all screw caps



## PAPER:

### ACCEPT

Newspapers & Inserts  
Cardboard & Paperboard (cereal & cracker boxes)  
Junk Mail & Office Paper  
Milk, Juice & Soup Cartons  
Phonebooks, Books, Magazines & Catalogs

### DO NOT ACCEPT

No Paper Contaminated by Food or Grease  
No Tissue  
No Gift Wrap

### GUIDELINES:

Flatten and cut cardboard to no larger than 2' X 2'  
Place shredded paper in paper bag, secure and label



## METAL AND GLASS:

### ACCEPT

Aluminum Bottles & Cans  
Steel, Tin & Bi-metal Cans  
Empty Aerosol Cans  
Food & Beverage Glass Bottles and Jars

### DO NOT ACCEPT

No Aluminum Pans or Foil  
No Empty Paint Cans

### GUIDELINES:

Empty and rinse all bottles and containers  
Remove and discard all screw caps



## SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

### Shovel Often and Early

Shoveling often during and immediately following the storm removes the snow from walkways and driveways before it gets packed down by tires and feet. The most important part of deicing is removing as much snow as possible before applying salt or sand - it's also great exercise!

For salt to be effective, air temperature needs to be warmer than the surface temperature of the area you want to treat. A little goes a long way.

## Realize

What touches the ground enters the water

Stormwater is rain or snowmelt and water from things people do, like overwatering the lawn or washing the car on the driveway. This water runs off our properties, into the street and down the storm drain - picking up pollutants on its way. Once it reaches the storm drain the water and the pollutants it carries is discharged into local waterways.

Untreated runoff is the biggest threat to our nation's water quality, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Let's make the small, important changes that will reduce that threat and improve water quality and our lives!

## WHY WE NEED TO SHOVEL OUR SIDEWALKS

Have you ever noticed how many people traverse the sidewalks in our Community? There are people who walk their dogs, walk their kids in strollers, walk for health, and walk for relaxation. There are students who walk to and from school. There are people who run for their health or run to the store. People run in the wee morning hours, people run at night, and there are even dedicated individuals who run on the weekend. Plus let's not forget those individuals who deliver our mail and newspapers on the sidewalks every day.

These are the reasons why it is important that everyone keeps their sidewalks clear of snow and ice. Not to mention: **"it's the law"**. The Village of Kimberly's Snow and Ice Municipal Ordinance (Sec. 430-10) states that owners or occupants of any parcel or lot which fronts or abuts any sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk clear of snow and ice to a minimum of five (5) feet in width. This must be done within twenty four (24) hours after the snow ceases to accumulate.



The Street Department does not want to clean your sidewalk, trouble is if we receive a complaint it is our job to clear them without notification, and it will cost the property owner a minimum of \$75.00.

## PUBLIC VIEWING OF ASSESSMENT ROLLS / "OPEN BOOK" AND BOARD OF REVIEW MEETING

The book containing all property assessments for the year 2016 will be open for public viewing on **Wednesday, May 4, 2016 from 4:00 PM until 6:00 PM** at the Kimberly Municipal Center. The Village Assessor will be present to explain the determining factors to your property assessment and answer questions.

If, after speaking with the Assessor, you disagree with the assessed value, then you have the right to request a Board of Review Hearing. This is done by filling out a Property Assessment Objection Form at the Village Clerk's office. **The deadline to file for a review hearing is 4:00 PM on Tuesday, May 24, 2016.**

Review Hearings will be scheduled during the Board of Review Meeting held on **Wednesday, May 25, 2016**. Each hearing will be assigned a specific time slot between 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM.

We are fortunate to live in a community that benefits from wonderful collaborative community efforts in the Fox Valley. One such effort is the **Fox Cities Book Festival** which is just around the corner, coming up on April 18-24, 2016. The Festival's mission is to connect writers with their readers and readers with those who write the books they read.

Kimberly-Little Chute Public Library serves as a venue for many of the Book Festival's visiting authors. This year, we are excited to host authors representing a diverse set of genres that we hope will be engaging for people of all ages.

We are particularly excited to host **Eliot Treichel**, an author with local ties to Kimberly. Eliot is the author of the YA novel *A Series of Small Maneuvers* (2015) and the short story collection *Close Is Fine* (2012), which received the Wisconsin Library Association Literary Award. His writing and photography have appeared in a variety of publications, including *Canoe & Kayak*, *Narrative*, *Beloit Fiction Journal*, *Cut-Bank*, and *Passages North*. He's been awarded a *Fishtrap Writing Fellowship* as well as residency fellowships at *PLAYA*. Eliot will present at the library, as well as work with students at Kimberly High School.



Other authors coming to our library include **James DeVita**. James lives near Spring Green, Wisconsin and is a core company member and literary manager at the American Players Theatre. He has worked extensively as a playwright and has published 2 novels for young readers. *A Winsome Murder* (2015), an adult thriller, was recently featured on WPR's Chapter-A-Day and takes us from Chicago's dark underbelly to the Wisconsin woods.

**Gini Athey** is the author of *The Shops on Wolf Creek Square* series: *Quilts Galore*, *Country Law*, *Rainbow Gardens*. Gina will visit the library in conjunction with the Little Chute Historical Society and the Little Chute Windmill Quilt Show, April 22-24.

**Kathryn Springer** grew up in a small town in northern Wisconsin where her parents published a weekly newspaper. In August 2004, her *Love Inspired*® debut novel, *Tested by Fire*, was published. Encouraging women in their faith journey is the reason Kathryn loves to write inspirational fiction.

**John Hildebrand** is a professor of English at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. # STREET DEPARTMENT

## SPRING YARD WASTE CLEAN UP

Yard Waste will be picked up on **April 5th and April 19th**, for residents with Tuesday garbage collection and **April 8th and April 22nd** for residents with Friday garbage collection. Garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18") in length will be picked up. Material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS** and not to exceed 50 lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the spring yard waste clean up.

*No Grass Clippings to include thatching your lawn!*

The Village also picks up yard waste on the 3rd Friday of each month, from May through September. This material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS**, with a special sticker attached to each bag. Stickers and Brown Lawn and Yard Waste Bags are available at the Street Department and Village Clerk's Office, \$1.00 per sticker and \$.50 per bag.

Residents needing a yard waste pick-up must call the Street Department at 788-7507 and be placed on a list. All yard waste must be set out on the terrace by 6:00 AM.

Branches longer than 18" require a special pickup on Thursdays. Residents must call 788-7507 prior to 4:00 PM on Wednesday to schedule a Thursday brush pickup.

## WHAT YOUR SUMP PUMP IS DOING FOR YOU

Spring is the most important time of the year to have a sump pump that works correctly. With the snow melting and the frost in the ground changing from ice to water, the ground around your home becomes saturated. Add the spring rains to the equation, and the foundation drain that surrounds a basement becomes very active. The water accumulating in this underground tube is directed into your sump pit. When full, the sump pump discharges the water to a storm water system (available in many neighborhoods) or to the lawn. This water eventually makes its way to the Fox River.

## SANITARY SEWER INFORMATION

Any resident experiencing a Sanitary Sewer backup is requested to contact the Kimberly Street Department (788-7507) Monday thru Thursday 7:30 AM – 4:00 PM and Friday 7:30 AM - 3:00 PM or Fox Valley Metro Police Department (788-7505) evenings and weekends to report the backup.

When a backup is reported, the Village Street Crew will check the Village's sanitary sewer main line for possible blockage and report back to the residents with findings.

Any sewer blockage between the main and the residence is the responsibility of the home owner.

## WARNING NOTICE

*Per Village ordinance 430-10, it is unlawful to deposit snow or ice (from shoveling, snow blowing, or plowing) onto Village streets, alleys or sidewalks. Depositing snow onto Village right of way not only causes added expense for snow removal it also creates hazardous conditions while driving on our streets or walking on our sidewalks.*

## Water Department Customers Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. **beginning April 11th through April 21st.** The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.**

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.



# Fire Department

## WELCOME NEW FIREFIGHTERS

Please join us in welcoming Al Vander Velden and Dave Kaschak as new members to the Kimberly Fire Department. Al and Dave are currently attending Firefighter certification scheduled to be completed in May and we look forward to working with them during a safe and long career as a Kimberly Firefighter.

## NEW VEHICLE PURCHASE

For two years the Fire Department "New Squad Committee" met to design a vehicle to replace an aging Support Unit, you may know it as "the green truck". Due to the high cost of a new vehicle (nearing \$475,000) the Committee was encouraged to look at all options before purchasing a new unit. Without much success at used vehicles in our area, a member of our committee, through the internet, found a nice used heavy rescue squad located in Indiana. After many phone calls to the St. Joseph Township Fire Chief, Kimberly Village Board approval, and a visit to Indiana, a very nice used "Heavy Rescue" Squad manufactured by Pierce was purchased for \$265,000. The Squad came with a full set of "top of the line" extraction equipment, two light towers to light up the night, a cascade system to fill SCBA cylinders, a 35kw generator, and ample room to store equipment used during emergencies.
