SPRING YARD WASTE CLEAN UP

Yard Waste will be picked up on **April 8th and April 22nd**, for residents with Tuesday garbage collection and **April 11th and 25th** for residents with Friday garbage collection. Garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 12”) in length will be picked up. Material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS** and not to exceed 50 lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the spring yard waste clean up.

No Grass Clippings to include thatching your lawn!

The Village also picks up yard waste on the 3rd Friday of each month, from May through September. This material **MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER LAWN AND YARD WASTE BAGS**, with a special sticker attached to each bag. Stickers and Brown Lawn and Yard Waste Bags are available at the Street Department and Village Clerk’s Office, \$1.00 per sticker and \$.50 per bag.

Branches longer than 12” require a special pickup on Thursdays. Residents must call 788-7507 prior to 4:00 PM on Wednesday to schedule a Thursday brush pickup.

2014 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE CLEAN SWEEP PROGRAM

Residents are encouraged to dispose of their hazardous materials during any Clean Sweep collection held at Outagamie County Solid Waste, located at 1419 Holland Road, Appleton. The program will run May – October on the following collection days and times:

- **The first Wednesday of the month from 8:00 am to 11:00 am**
- **The third Saturday of the month from 8:00 am to 11:00 am**
- **Appointments are required by calling 920-832-5277 Option #3**

LIBRARY NOTES . . .

Each year, the public libraries of the Fox Cities and UW-Fox Valley come together with the goal of building a larger sense of community and to promote literacy through a program called Fox Cities Reads. We select an author and book title to promote, and we encourage the people in our communities to read the book and think, talk, listen, and grow together.

“Past Fox Cities Reads selections have taken readers places that they might otherwise never go,” states Joe Bongers, Fox Cities Reads co-chair. “Through the pages of these books we’ve ridden along with volunteer firefighters in rural Wisconsin and glimpsed the perilous conditions experienced by migrant workers along the U.S./Mexico border. We’ve seen life improved by the arts and education in inner city America, and most recently, we explored the vital role that nature plays in the health and well-being of all people. We’ve had the opportunity to discuss these books with the authors and our neighbors, learning more about the world, ourselves, and each other in the process.”

This year’s Reads selection is entitled, *Wonder*, by R. J. Palacio. *Wonder* has been on the New York Best Seller list for middle grades for over 58 consecutive weeks and was chosen not only for its widespread appeal, but also because we believe the book will provide an opportunity to engage a large portion of our community in discussions about bullying, accepting people who are different than ourselves, and about disabilities and challenges in general.

Wonder is a story that inspires compassion, self-reflection, and empathy. The characters are unique and yet familiar in some way, so that your heart immediately intertwines with the story of this special boy, Auggie, his family, friends, and others who challenge him along the way. While written for middle school ages, the writing is entertaining for people of any age or walk of life and will lead to valuable family discussions about what it is to be a friend, to stand up for others different than ourselves, and to find our own way in a complicated world.

The precepts in the book are things that all of us should consider and grow from. One precept, or rule to live by, states, “When given the choice between being right or being kind, choose kind.” The book has started a Choose Kind movement across the country where people can sign a pledge to make a difference through random acts of kindness.

We are thrilled that *Wonder* has been selected as the 2014 Fox Cities Reads and hope that people of all ages will read, talk, listen, and grow while considering how they can make a difference in their community. KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE

Children's Curiosity with FIRE can be DEADLY

Children are one of the highest risk groups for deaths in residential fires. At home, children may have a tendency to play with lighters and matches. Bedrooms, closets, and under beds are private/"secret" places where there are a lot of things that catch fire easily.

Here are a few tips to help prevent children from playing with fire:

1. Keep matches and lighters locked up and away from children.
2. Teach your child that fire is a tool, not a toy.
3. Check under beds and in closets for burnt matches or evidence your child may be playing with fire.

Cooking with Children Present

Young children in the kitchen while food is being cooked can be a dangerous situation. In order to prevent burn and scalding injuries, please follow the guidelines below.

Keep children away from cooking areas by enforcing a "kid-free zone" of 3 feet around the stove. Keep hot foods and liquids away from table and counter edges. When young children are present, use the stove's back burners whenever possible. NEVER hold a child while cooking, drinking, or carrying hot foods or liquids. Turn frying pan handles away from the edge of the stove.

EVERY SECOND COUNTS

In the event of a fire, remember that every second counts. In order to get out of your home safely, families must always be prepared. Please discuss and practice escape plans with your family and practice the plan at least twice every year.

- Let your children hear what a smoke alarm sounds like.
- Discuss and practice methods of getting out of your home
- Discuss and practice a meeting place outside of the home

WISCONSIN STATE LAW requires that dogs be licensed and rabies vaccinated by age 5 months. Licenses must be renewed each year by March 31st. By purchasing your licenses prior to March 31st you will avoid a \$5.00 late fee.

You must provide the current rabies vaccination information including date given, expiration date, manufacturer and serial number. If you obtained a dog license in 2013, but no longer own the dog, please call us at 788-7500 so that we can remove your information from our database. Thank you for your cooperation.

THIS NOTICE SERVES AS YOUR REMINDER TO OBTAIN A LICENSE. YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE ANOTHER NOTICE FROM OUR OFFICE. Owners of unlicensed dogs are subject to a \$114.00 fine.



Per village ordinance, your dog must be on a leash and you must pick up all animal feces.

As a reminder to anyone walking their dogs in Village of Kimberly parks, especially Sunset Park, dogs **MUST** be on a leash (per ordinance) and dogs **ARE NOT ALLOWED** on the baseball/softball fields at any time.

Kimberly Water Department Customers Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. **beginning April 7th through April 17th.** The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.**

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.

WHAT YOUR SUMP PUMP IS DOING FOR YOU

Spring is the most important time of the year to have a sump pump that works correctly. With the snow melting and the frost in the ground changing from ice to water, the ground around your home becomes saturated. Add the spring rains to the equation, and the foundation drain that surrounds a basement becomes very active. The water accumulating in this underground tube is directed into your sump pit. When full, the sump pump discharges the water to a storm water system (available in many neighborhoods) or to the lawn. This water eventually makes its way to the Fox River.

Any resident experiencing a Sanitary Sewer backup is requested to contact the Kimberly Street Department (788-7507) Monday thru Thursday 7:30 AM - 4:00 PM and Friday 7:30 AM - 3:00 PM or Fox Valley Metro Police Department (788-7505) evenings and weekends to report the backup.

When a backup is reported, the Village Street Crew will check the Village's sanitary sewer main line for possible blockage and report back to the residents with findings.

Any sewer blockage between the main and the residence is the responsibility of the home owner.
