President's POINT OF VIEW

What a quick and active time it has been with the KRA hosting a youth tournament, Paperfest celebrating thirty years, the welcoming of two new team members after the retirement of others, streets being reconstructed, a plethora of activity in the Cedars development area and thousands of folks finding relief in the cool waters of the swimming facility. The Amphitheater group once again provided enjoyable Sunday evening programming and record numbers were seen in the youth baseball and recreation programs. I am hopeful that you found much to do and have enjoyed the summer months.

The fall brings youngsters traveling to and from school, many afternoon activities, great anticipation for high school sports and of course we have the Packers working to recover from last year's season. Please be alert and cautious in those school zones, root for your Makers and get yourselves ready for "leaf season." I know that as the leaves fall, the recently retired Dave VanderVelden will grin knowing that his least favorite duty coordinating the collection of nature's gift will be on the plate of someone else!

We are pleased to welcome Allyn Dannhoff to the VOK team where he takes the role of Director of Operations with oversight in to streets, (leaf collection included!) sewers, asset management and many more things that make the village services come to life. Eric Woodke is now immersed in his role as the Street Department Foreman providing leadership and teamwork with our street crew under the direction of the Director of Operations. We are pleased to have these two experienced team members join us and make an impact.

After a spring election, an early summer primary, a late summer primary, comes the November election cycle. We encourage everyone to exercise their right to vote. I am sure that by the time election day rolls around we will all have tired of the non-stop advertising that is filled with negativity, second guessing and often unfair character

attacks. In these election cycles I am reminded that the best "politics" happens at the local level. In YOUR elected officials, you have a group dedicated to service and to listening intently to concerns and taking appropriate actions to address them. Your local elected officials are also beholden to the election decisions made for offices at the county, state and federal levels as those in "higher places" make decisions that too often cost us money, or restrict the return of monies to the local level. We continue to see a steady decline in shared revenue and often are faced with unfunded mandates created with little input from us. We see decisions like not funding warning sirens at the county level made arbitrarily and are left to determine the long term best course for safety alerts in the face of weather issues. We see the state continue to fluctuate the formula for returning shared revenues or restrict levy limits in part to help create a smokescreen they call "reducing local property taxes" to help them gain re-election. The federal level is a whole other animal and one that would be well served to sit in on a village board meeting to understand cooperation, compassion and human decency. So, I ask that you exercise your right to vote and to choose those who will make decisions that will impact our quality of life here in Kimberly. Ask tough questions of the candidates and let your voices be heard. None of us is as good as all of us!

I somewhat apologize for my rant there, but I am writing this on the heels of watching and listening to the Washington and State political ads. Watching the Senate hearings and the Presidential meetings with North Korea and Russia and the incredible "spin" surrounding them all. I simply see a call to action for all of us to make our voices heard. Heard in a respectful and productive manner, heard with the understanding that we all want to treat others with dignity and respect and that we value what Kimberly holds for us as we unite to maintain Kimberly as a great place to live, learn, work and play.

General Election November 6, 2018

What's on my ballot?

The following positions will be voted on in the General Election (candidates determined by the August Partisan primary): Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, U.S. Senator, Representative to Congress District 8, State Senator District 1, Representative to the Assembly District 3, County Sheriff, County Coroner, and Clerk of Circuit Court.

Voter Registration & Registration Updates

If you haven't voted in Wisconsin since before the last presidential election or changed your name or address since you last voted, you must complete a registration form. You can do this:

- online at www.MyVote.wi.gov through 11:59 p.m. on October 17th
- by mailing a registration form to the clerk; postmarked by October 17th
- in person at the clerk's office through 5:00 p.m. on November 2nd

You will need Proof of RESIDENCY to complete the registration or registration update. A WI driver's license or ID, utility bill, bank statement, or other government document work best to prove your name and your current address.

Absentee Ballots

(College students – order your absentee ballot now before going back to school!) Registered voters WITH PHOTO ID ON FILE can request to have a ballot mailed to them. The Absentee Ballot Request form can be found at the Clerk's Office, on our website www.vokimberly.org, or electronically filled out at www.MyVote.wi.gov. The deadline to have a ballot mailed to you is 5:00 p.m. on November 1st - *note the late deadline does not guarantee you will be able to receive and return your ballot by the 8:00 p.m. November 6, 2018 deadline.*

You can also absentee vote in person at the clerk's office during regular office hours the two weeks before an election. You will need to show your ID.

Please contact the clerk's office if you have any questions or concerns about elections in Kimberly.

STREET DEPARTMENT

LEAF PICKUP

Leaf pick up will begin around the second week in October and continue through November 21st, weather permitting. Place all leaves on the terrace for pickup.

- Rake leaves to the terrace, **NOT INTO THE STREET.**
- **DO NOT** put leaves in bags, leaves which are placed in bags or any container **WILL NOT** be picked up.
- **DO NOT** rake twigs or branches with the leaves. They will clog the vacuum.
- Please keep plastic and paper out of piles.

Please keep in mind when leaf pickup begins the volume of leaves are minimal which means you may see the trucks canvas the town more often. Later when all the trees drop their leaves, usually overnight, the volume of leaves slows down pick up times and the trucks take longer to get through the Village. When leaf pick up is at its prime you may only get picked up once in a two week period. Once the truck has been down your street at may take that long to return.

WATER DEPARTMENT – METER CHANGES

Kimberly Water Utility has completed updating all residential water meters to radio read meters inside their houses. Therefore, if you re-side your house in the future, your contractor can remove the meter attached to your siding and discard it. The meters on houses were only left there so you would not have a hole in your siding. Commercial and other customers still need to contact the water utility before disconnecting their outside water meters.

FREE TIRE PICK UP

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free tire pick up **ONLY** on the following day: **Friday, September 21st** for the entire village.

This free tire pick up has been authorized by Outagamie County and the Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, and tires cannot be larger than 17" passenger vehicle tires. (NO business generated tires)



FREE FALL YARD WASTE

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free fall yard waste pick up **ONLY** on the following day:

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 19th

for residents with a FRIDAY garbage collection

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23rd

for residents with a TUESDAY garbage collection

Yard waste consisting of garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18" in length) will be picked up. Yard Waste must be put in lawn and yard waste bags and not exceed 50lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the FREE fall yard waste pick up. Once a street has been picked up, they **WILL NOT** return! Yard waste will be picked up on your refuse collection day **ONLY**.

NO GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES OR PLASTIC BAGS!

WEEKLY BRUSH PICKUP

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter **MUST** be called in by 4:00p.m. on **WEDNESDAY** for a Thursday pickup.

KIMBERLY WATER DEPARTMENT CUSTOMER SEMI ANNUAL HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. beginning **September 10th through September 20th**. The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY**.

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.





Look for the green check mark after the title to ensure the security is turned off. If you wait a few seconds before exiting your session the self-check will even display book recommendations.

Kimberly - Little Chute Public Library is pleased to offer print-from-anywhere services. Print from any web-connected device, including your own personal laptop, your smartphone or tablet, and even your computer at home. Just go to <http://www.printeron.net/kcpl/kimberly> to send your document securely to the library. When you use this service, you will create a code to preview and release your print job from the library print release station at your convenience. Print jobs are saved for 72 hours and you can reprint as often as necessary in that time period. Fees apply - Black and White is \$0.10/page and Color is \$0.25/page.



CALL 911 WHEN YOU NEED HELP

The Kimberly Fire Department would like you to know a few things:

- You will not be charged for calling 911 to dispatch the Fire Department.
- There is no call too small or too large. When in doubt call 911
- Don't be bothered if we respond to your call with lights and sirens. It is not for the purpose of drawing attention to you or the Fire Department, it is required as we need to respond in a safe and timely manor

SMOKE DETECTORS AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

As the heating season nears, residents will be making their homes energy efficient to help lower heating costs. When we close up our homes, we increase the chance of elevated carbon monoxide levels. Now is the time to replace batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. It is recommended smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors be replaced every 5 – 10 years.
