While scary and hurtful in loss of trees, damage to properties and inconvenience of loss of power, the “2019 storm” once again revealed the good that is Kimberly. Neighbors checking on neighbors, a sharing of a generator or a chain saw. A volunteer fire force that immediately responded and assured safety. A street crew who worked with resolve to open roadways and then tack on double shifts on Sunday to address the hanging branches and begin the painstaking process of brush pick up. Metro Police Department setting up command posts on both sides of the river and patrolling with a mindset of helping in whatever way they could. The village administration and leadership team coordinating efforts and engaging the county disaster relief team to share help tips for safety, offering cleanup kits for sumps that were unpowered and allowed for wet basements and manning a cooling station and charging station after securing generators to enable operation at the municipal complex. I was impressed by the teamwork and results and I trust you were as well. We are grateful that there were no reported injuries and I am amazed that Paperfest enthusiasts came out in big numbers for the Saturday performance! The festival surely took on a new look with no big top after the winds blew, yet the “show went on” – bravo.

The cleanup will likely continue as you receive this copy of Kimtalk; thank you for your patience. I guess when one looks at the piles of limbs, logs and leaves, we can find a small sliver of silver lining in that leaf pick up may be reduced this fall! Speaking of which, our Director of Operations, Allyn Dannhoff has really been working at finding efficiencies in that process. Recently, the board authorized another leaf vacuum. Allyn, Eric and the street crew are changing the way leaf pick up is being done. More route driven and more passes with the hope of aligning with your eagerness to rake and Mother Nature’s willingness to release leaves before snow falls. Hopeful all will be pleased with the effort.

Speaking of pleasing efforts ... Once again the Amphitheater team, the Community Band, the KRA, KBO, Paperfest Committee, Library Staff, Parks Department and Sunset Beach Teams all brought forth some fine summer opportunities to recreate – Thanks to all!

The future of library services became a focal point a few months back as our partners in library services decided they were at a point where they want to go it alone. We are in the process of creating what we had 20+ years ago when we were the Kimberly Public Library, and I assure you that our commitment remains to provide the services YOU desire and a top notch library. Fox Cities Marathon

The 28th Annual Fox Cities Marathon will be held on **Sunday, September 22, 2019.**

There will be “**NO PARKING SIGNS**” placed along the route. Runners will enter Kimberly as early as 7:25 a.m. and the last runners will exit Kimberly by about 10:20 a.m. Please plan alternate routes of travel if you plan on being out early on September 22nd.

STREET DEPARTMENT

LEAF PICKUP

Leaf pick up will begin around the second week in October and continue through November 22nd, weather permitting. Place all leaves on the terrace for pickup.

- Rake leaves to the terrace, **NOT INTO THE STREET.**
- **DO NOT** put leaves in bags, leaves which are placed in bags or any container **WILL NOT** be picked up.
- **DO NOT** rake twigs or branches with the leaves. They will clog the vacuum.
- Please keep plastic and paper out of piles.

Please keep in mind when leaf pickup begins, the volume of leaves are minimal which means you may see the trucks canvas the town more often. Later when all the trees drop their leaves, usually overnight, the volume of leaves slows down pickup times and the trucks take longer to get through the Village. When leaf pick up is at its prime, you may only get picked up once in a two week period. Once the truck has been down your street it may take that long to return.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

In attempts to keep residents better informed of Leaf Collection progress, the Street Department will post regular progress and planned route updates, at least weekly on the Street Department Web Page. It is hoped this service will offer residents the ability to project when leaf collection equipment will arrive in your neighborhood.

Additionally, the Street Department is constructing a Yard Waste Drop-Off Site with the goal of opening it for use by early October in efforts to provide residents the option to deposit leaves at this site.

FREE FALL YARD WASTE

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free fall yard waste pick up **ONLY** on the following day: **MONDAY, OCTOBER 14th** for residents with a **TUESDAY** garbage collection or **MONDAY, OCTOBER 21st** for residents with a **FRIDAY** garbage collection. Yard waste consisting of garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18" in length) will be picked up. Yard Waste must be put in lawn and yard waste bags and not exceed 50lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the **FREE** fall yard waste pick up. Once a street has been picked up, they **WILL NOT** return! **NO GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES OR PLASTIC BAGS!**

FREE TIRE PICK UP

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free tire pick up **ONLY** on the following day: **Wednesday, September 18th** for the entire village. This free tire pick up has been authorized by Outagamie County and the Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, and tires cannot be larger than 17" passenger vehicle tires. (NO business generated tires)

KIMBERLY WATER DEPARTMENT CUSTOMER SEMI ANNUAL HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. beginning **September 16th through September 27th**. The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water. If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY**. Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.

REPORT A CONCERN AND AFTER HOURS MESSAGES

The Street Department has two venues providing residents the ability to Report a Concern or leave a message after hours, such as reporting potholes, damaged street signs, and fallen trees or limbs. Residents may leave a voice message on the Street Department's phone, 920-788-7507, or may send email messages to streets@vokimberly.org. Residents are also encouraged to use these when requesting to be placed on the Brush Pick Up schedule or the Yard Waste Pick Up schedule. Please remember to submit these requests before 2p.m. the day before the scheduled collection day, and always include your name, address, and phone number to better ensure timely service.

WEEKLY BRUSH PICKUP

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter **MUST** be called in by 2:00p.m. on **WEDNESDAY** for a Thursday pickup.

YARD WASTE DROP-OFF SITE IS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Earlier this summer, the Village Board approved construction of a Yard Waste Drop-Off Site at the Street Department. While construction started in July, progress has been slowed by the July 20th storm, as all available Street Department Crew members have been assigned to tree and brush clean up. Progress will resume as the Storm Clean Up efforts wind down in the coming weeks.

The Yard Waste Drop-Off Site will accept grass trimmings, garden plants, and leaves. Brush and tree trimmings will not be allowed to be dropped off at this site due to space limitation. Brush and tree trimmings will continue to be collected from the terraces in the same manner as presently conducted. The complete rules for use, hours of operation, and obtaining a Yard Waste Drop-Off Permit for this new facility and service are anticipated to be finalized in September. It is the Street Department's goal to open the Yard Waste Drop-Off Site in October in efforts to provide residents the option to deposit leaves at this site if preferred.

The Street Department will post additional information for obtaining a permit, hours of operation and use rules at www.vokimberly.org as information is finalized.

2020 SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT – GREEN DOT PROGRAM

The Village board has an ongoing sidewalk rehabilitation program to provide safe walking surfaces for pedestrians. The primary concern is whether or not sections of sidewalk present a hazard or potentially hazardous condition to pedestrians, bicycles, strollers, etc. This fall the Street Department will be evaluating sidewalks in the area bounded by Kimberly Ave, Joseph St., the railroad tracks, and Marcella St. for sections to be replaced in 2020. Sections identified for replacement will be marked with a green paint dot.

The following conditions will require sidewalk replacement:

- ¾" vertical displacement between adjoining sections.
- Settlement out of vertical alignment more than 1" per foot from normal grade.
- Cracks ½" or wider in width.
- Settlement in abutting cracks or blocks that trap water.
- Broken corners, multiple cracks, or surface lacerations where concrete is popped out or loose and creates depressions.
- Sidewalk that has protruding structures over 1" (trees, poles, etc.)
- Dropped edges.

Appearance of the sidewalk is not a factor. Conditions such as discoloring, minor cracks, checking, negative sloping away from the curb, minor settling without displacement, etc. generally are not a cause for replacement.

Additional information will be sent to affected property owners toward the end of winter, beginning of spring next year when the Department knows the estimated cost for each property.



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STORM CLEAN-UP ACTIVITIES

On Saturday, July 20th, the Village experienced a storm that left a vast amount of tree and brush damage and destruction. Perhaps more damage than has been experienced in past storms. Street Department crews were called in immediately following the storm and commenced Village wide clean-up activities. These activities continue through-out the community and will include the following phases:

1. Road Obstructions. Street Department crews were called in shortly after the storm to clear road obstructions. By the end of the day most, if not all, roads were passable. Crews commenced clean-up activities the following day.

2. Tree and brush removal. As of July 31, the Street Department crews, coupled with a contractor, completed the first neighborhood by neighborhood route through the Village for removing tree and brush debris. A second round through the Village commenced on July 31. Tree and brush removal rounds will continue through August.

3. Street Cleaning. As the bulk of the tree and brush is removed by trucking, the Street Crews are following up by cleaning up and chipping smaller piles, removing random debris from the roads, and then employing the street sweeper to remove the bulk of the residual twigs and leaves.

4. Bulky and Large Item Removal. By coincidence this storm occurred just prior to the regular scheduled Bulky and Large Item Removal days. The amount of material placed to the curb for collection was greater than most months.

5. Damaged street trees and limb removal. As of July 31, a Village wide assessment is being conducted to gauge the extent of damage and develop a list of trees and limbs to remove. Options for removal will be evaluated in efforts to perform this work in a manner that balances timeliness and cost effectiveness. Stump removal will also be evaluated in this manner.

6. Tree and Brush Disposal. The Village has hired a contractor to shred the tree and brush refuse resulting from the storm. Shredding operations appear to be keeping pace with tree and brush removal operations. So it is anticipated shredding operations will come to a close shortly after tree and brush collection is completed.

The post storm clean-up activities are extensive, time consuming, and labor intensive. The Street Department Crews and contractor have been working longer days since the storm in effort to expedite clean-up efforts. We ask for your continued patience as the amount of damage is substantial and will take several weeks to complete.

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

Volunteer Opportunities abound at Kimberly Little Chute Library

The Villages of Kimberly and Little Chute have taken steps to separate the Joint Library. The Library team is busy preparing for the intended split of the joint department on January 1, 2021. It is our desire to make the transition seamless as each Village selects members for their own Library Board in the last half of 2020. Currently the timeline is to have a final Demerger Agreement approved by the Village Boards in November. The following step is draft and pass ordinances creating individual library boards in the first half of 2020. Following the establishment of each community's library board staff will be assigned or hired for the opening of each library January 2, 2021. The final step is to dissolve the Joint library board after the 2020 Annual report is filed with the State of Wisconsin.

Library Board members are appointed by the Village President for a three-year term. If you are interested in serving on the Library Board, please contact the Library Director or Village Administrator of your community.

The primary responsibilities of the Library Board are spelled out in Wisconsin Statutes under Section 43.58 as follows:

- Exclusive control of all library expenditures.
- Purchasing of a library site and the erection of the library building when authorized.
- Exclusive control of all lands, buildings, money, and property acquired or leased by the municipality for library purposes.
- Supervising the administration of the library and appointing a librarian.

Currently, your library board meets monthly for about an hour. Some topics may require longer meetings through the demerger process and in the early stages of the new structure.

Volunteer and Join the Friends of Kimberly Little Chute Library (FOLKS)!

The Friends of the Library strives to enhance our library's program, services and resources through our volunteer efforts and by enlightening our community about what our library has to offer. Come to our meeting or ask a library staff member to learn more. The Friends meet six times a year and would like your help to spread the word about events, fund raise, and lend a hand during programming. Be involved as little or as much as you like and meet some of the most wonderful volunteers in your neighborhood.

The primary responsibilities of the Friend of the Library are to engage the community in supporting library programs and be library advocates.

VOTER REGISTRATION

If you are a new voter or have moved or changed your name, you must register to vote.

Update your voter registration at least 20 days before an election in order to be pre-printed in the regular poll book. Complete the paperwork at the Village Clerk's Office or online using www.myvote.wi.gov. You will need proof of residency that states your current name and address; such as WI Driver's License/ID, utility bill, bank statement, credit card statement, pay stub or government document. Please contact the Clerk's Office if you need assistance.

There are NO additional Elections scheduled for 2019.

KimTalk August Cedars Update

It is a busy time of year for the Cedars riverfront redevelopment! 2019 has brought the Village plenty of opportunities and the ability to make great progress at the site. Here's the latest related to the transformation and the future of the riverfront area:

Rivers Edge Subdivision: This nearly 20 acre subdivision on the most western edge of the property offers over 40 single family lots and two planned unit developments. In May of 2019, the area was sold to a developer to market, construct and sell all the single family homes and planned development units. If you are interested in a single family lot or a future planned unit development home, please contact Tom Juza, Developer at 920-371-1075 tjuza@tjuza.com. The subdivision will receive concrete roads in August and additional landscape screening and buffers in the fall. The area offers a quiet residential setting with amazing river views!

Riverfront Developments: In the future as you travel along Papermill Run from the west side to the east side several luxury apartment units are under construction! The Ebb and Flow structures have started and anticipated completion is set for the Summer of 2020. The Oasis, another structure located at the end of Sidney Street has ramped up construction. This luxury apartment complex will be completed in the Spring of 2020. Midwest Expansion will also be converting a former mill structure into a restaurant experience located just north of the Main Street cul-de-sac. This restaurant will offer riverfront dining and views of the Fox. The Village is working together with the Developer to create an overlook experience between the restaurant and the dam. The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation awarded the Village with \$250,000 in June of 2019 for the construction of the overlook feature! Concepts are currently being designed and construction is anticipated to begin in 2020.

Papermill Estates: Located at the corner of Main Street and Maes Avenue, this 49 lot planned unit development continues to grow! This development offers a relaxing carefree lifestyle. Treaty Park: A very exciting time for the entrance to the center of The Cedars redevelopment. Treaty Park has taken shape this summer and will be complete in the fall of 2019. This park will offer a new ADA accessible play structure, gazebo shade structure, historical artifacts from the mill site, over 100 new plantings and open green space. A grand opening for the park will be announced in the near future.

The Roots: Just east of Treaty Park is a new apartment and mixed-use commercial development. The Roots is a community development by Midwest Expansion that will relate to the riverfront Ebb, Flow and Oasis living concepts. This apartment complex has broken ground on one unit and will begin four more units this fall. The first unit rentals will be available in the coming months.
