### Delivering the Services You Expect at Affordable Prices

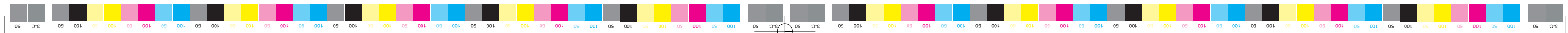

## BUDGET AND TAX RATE

As you are probably aware, the State of Wisconsin financial crisis has required a reduction in the amount of your income tax that is sent back to the local community in the form of Shared Revenues. For the Village of Kimberly, that amount is over \$100,000. Together with rising costs in many areas, we are faced with some very tough financial decisions. It would require a 15% increase in the tax rate to absorb that lost revenue.

The good news is that the Kimberly Village Board has committed to holding the line on property taxes. The Kimberly Village Board has historically exercised tremendous fiscal restraint. Unlike their State counterparts, the Village of Kimberly did not spend everything they could; they only spent what was needed.

The bad news is, this will mean a reduction in local services that you receive.

Staff is working on recommended program and service cuts for presentation to the Kimberly Village Board. Everyone, from staff to the Village Board, knows that these reductions are going to be difficult. You, as residents, have come to expect certain services. We, as staff, know that residents rely on these services, and have come to expect a certain service level for their safety, transportation, sanitation and leisure activity needs. The difficult decision will be which ones to reduce or eliminate.



Together, staff and the Village Board will spend several months developing and discussing the budget for the Village of Kimberly. If you would like to participate in these discussions, the review dates will be September 15<sup>th</sup> and September 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. The Public Hearing on the budget will be held on November 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. After the public hearing, the budget ordinance will be considered by the Kimberly Village Board.

Citizen input is vital to the strength of any community. Your elected officials must make these difficult decisions. They understand and appreciate that such decisions are what you elected them to perform on your behalf. However, they do value citizen feedback, and depend on your comments when making these difficult decisions. If you have any questions or comments, please feel free to contact your local elected officials.

## SUMP PUMP INSPECTIONS

Did you know that when clear water, such as the water from your sump-pump or rain gutters enters into the sanitary sewer system the Village of Kimberly has to pay a fee to the Heart of the Valley Metropolitan Sewer District (HOVMSD) for treating this water as if it were sewage? And did you know that the fee for treating this clear water is passed on to you through a sewer user fee? Each time a rain storm passes through the Village the HOVMSD monitors the sewage received from our system, compares them to a normal non rainy day and bills us for the excess water.

So in a community wide effort to control clear water from entering the sanitary sewer system the Village Building Inspector will inspect **ALL SUMP-PUMPS**, this includes commercial and residential. Any homeowner, or business owner who would like to have their sump-pit inspected should call the Village offices to schedule an appointment. This includes all homeowners who do not have a sump-pump in their basement, or do not have a basement. The Building Inspector will eventually inspect every home or business and document the findings for the records.

Also any homeowner that has a problem with a sump pump or feels their pump is not working properly should call the Building Inspector for an inspection.

All homeowners that are part of this year's mini-storm sewer project must connect their sump-pump to the system. These connections, and the sump pits in your basement must be inspected for compliance. Please call the Village at 788-7500 to schedule an inspection, the Inspector is very flexible, and at times can be at your home in just a few short minutes.

Together we can minimize the clear water entering our sanitary sewer system and save dollars in return.

The Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) was enacted by Congress to make sweeping reforms in the way elections are conducted. Under HAVA, no later than January 1, 2006, each state must implement in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner, a single, uniform, official centralized, interactive computerized Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS). Our State Elections Board is in the process of implementing plans to meet the requirements of HAVA.

Until the Statewide Voter Registration System is in place, we must continue to maintain our registrations. So please remember:

- If you are new to the Village of Kimberly, please stop in and register to vote. If you have a driver's license, we will need to see it. If your driver's license does not have your current residence listed we will need to see proof of residence (a copy of a utility bill, bank statement, or pay check). If you do not have a driver's license we need the last four digits of your social security number.
- If you have moved within the Village of Kimberly, please stop in to change your address. You may have changed wards and do not want to wait in the wrong line to vote.
- If your name has changed you will need to re-register under your new name.
- If you are not sure you are registered to vote, please call. It is easy for us to check our records and will save you time on Election Day.
- If you are attending college and a registered voter in the Village of Kimberly, you can apply for an absentee ballot to be mailed to you. Stop in or call to request an application.

Our office is open Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM and we are available to help answer your questions regarding elections and voter registration. Please avoid waiting in line by asking your questions and making the necessary changes now.

## WILD ANIMALS

Recently there has been a large increase in the number of calls from citizens concerned about wild animals. We share our Village with a great number of wild animals, including deer, skunks, opossums, woodchucks, fox and raccoons. Lately, the majority of calls have been about sick raccoons and a concern that they may be rabid.



Rabies cannot be ruled out as a cause for illness in any mammal, but, since there has not been a recorded case of raccoon rabies in Wisconsin since 1996, it is very unlikely that is the cause of the illness. So why are the raccoons sick? All animals eventually get sick and die. We are at a

high cycle of raccoon population at this time so more of them are being seen. If you see a sick wild animal, the best policy is to just leave it alone. If you feel a real need to get rid of the animal, there are professional wildlife control businesses listed in the Yellow Pages under "Animal Rescue, Relocation & Transportation". Fox Valley Metro P.D. also has a live trap that can be loaned out to citizens for nuisance animals, however the citizen is responsible for the disposal of the animal. Shooting an animal or having an Officer shoot an animal is not a reasonable option. Firing a gun with-in the Village limits is much more dangerous than any sick animal. We are lucky to live in a community with such a large array of wildlife, enjoy them.

## MOTORIZED SCOOTERS

There has been a lot of confusion as to the legality of riding motorized scooters in the Village due to a new State law. The new State law only allows the "Segway" type vehicles to operate on streets and sidewalks. It does NOT allow the use of other motorized scooters, such as the Razor style or motorized skateboards.

Technically, to operate the "Razor" style motorized scooter on the roadway both the vehicle and the operator would have to be licensed. Under no conditions could it be operated on the sidewalk, as it is defined by law as a "motor vehicle" and does not fall under any of the exceptions to licensing or operation under State law. The only place a motorized scooter could be legally operated would be on private property with the owner's permission.

# – Trick or Treaters –

## HALLOWEEN

Halloween is quickly approaching. Here are some safety tips and suggestions for the Trick or Treaters, Parents and Homeowners.

- Carry a flashlight.
- Walk, don't run.
- Stay on Sidewalks.
- Obey traffic signals.
- Stay in familiar neighborhoods.
- Don't cut across yards or driveways.
- Wear a watch you can read in the dark.
- Make sure costumes don't drag on the ground.
- Shoes should fit (even if they don't go with your costume).
- Avoid wearing masks while walking from house to house.
- Carry only flexible knives, swords or other props.
- (If no sidewalk) walk on the left side of the road facing traffic.
- Wear clothing with reflective markings or tape.
- Approach only houses that are lit.
- Stay away from and don't pet animals you don't know.



## PARENTS

- Make your child eat dinner before setting out.
- Children should carry quarters or cell phones so they can call home.
- Ideally, children of any age should be accompanied by an adult.



- If your children go on their own, be sure they wear a watch, preferably one that can be read in the dark.
- If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material.
- Older children should know where to reach you and when to be home.
- You should know where they're going.
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected before consuming anything.
- Look at the wrapping carefully and toss out anything that looks suspect.

## HOMEOWNERS

- Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that can trip the young ones.
- Pets get frightened on Halloween, contain them to protect them from cars or inadvertently biting a trick-or-treater.
- Battery powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame.
- If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will be walking or standing.
- Make sure paper or cloth yard decorations won't be blown into a flaming candle.
- Healthy food alternatives for trick-or-treaters include packages of low-fat crackers with cheese or peanut butter filling, single-serve boxes of cereal, packaged fruit rolls, mini boxes of raisins and single-serve packets of low-fat popcorn that can be microwaved later.
- Non-food treats: plastic rings, pencils, stickers, erasers, coins.

**Fall-Winter-and-Spring hours** began Tuesday, September 2, 2003. The Saturday hours are being changed in response to user requests to be open earlier in the day. Therefore beginning Saturday, September 6<sup>th</sup> the library will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. instead of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The hours in both locations will be:  
Monday through Thursday 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.  
Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.  
Saturday 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Registration for preschool story time began Tuesday, September 2 for children ages 2-5. Parents may come into either library or call to register a child. The library's website has specific information about class days, times,



ages of children as well as the name of the preschool story time reader. Check <http://www.owls.lib.wi.us/kim-lit/> and select "Youth" in the blue bar at the top of the page. Then select the sections of interest to you.

Several new kits of materials for preschoolers and early elementary school-aged children are being added into the library called "Take It To Your Seat" and will be available to be checked out after September 16<sup>th</sup>. These kits are learning tools covering subjects such as rhyming, colors, numbers, puzzles, sounds, telling time, following directions, sorting, and matching. Parents are encouraged to check these items out and work on the skills with their young children. Activity sheets that may be kept by the parent and child are included in the kits. These kits will be located near the easy nonfiction books.

Unabridged books on tape for young adults will soon be available in limited quantities. This collection will consist of both fiction and nonfiction titles of interest to people ages 12-18 but may be checked out by anyone. As the collection grows it will be found on the shelves in the young adult department.

Beginning October 1<sup>st</sup>, both libraries will have several shelves of materials that will be available as book sale items. In this way people won't have to wait two or more years for the library's large book sale. Prices will be individually marked on each item and may be paid for at the circulation desk. Speaking of book sales, the most recent sale on August 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> brought in almost \$2000 dollars. This money will be used to purchase new materials for both of the libraries. If you were there at the sale and went home with armloads of books, videos, and cassettes, you know what a bargain you got. The library thanks you for visiting the sale.

## STREET DEPARTMENT

### LEAF PICKUP

Leaf pick up will begin around the 1<sup>st</sup> of October and continue through November 15<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting.

**Rake leaves to the terrace, not into the street; DO NOT put leaves in bags. Leaves, which are placed in bags or any container, will not be picked up. Do not rake twigs or branches with the leaves, they will clog the vacuum.**

**Please keep plastic and paper out of the piles. Rake leaves into low piles so children are not hidden from motorist's view**

Pick up will start at the west-end of the village and move east, completing as soon as possible. It takes about two weeks to make one round of the entire village, so please be patient and rake accordingly. Also, remember the street sweeper is different from the leaf vacuum. The sweeper only sweeps streets, **not piles of leaves.**

### ANTI-FREEZE DROP OFF SITE

The Heart of the Valley Metropolitan Sewage District offers an anti-freeze drop off site, adjacent to their main office on Thilmany Road in Kaukauna. This drop site is open from 7:00 AM - 2:30 PM Monday through Friday and 7:00 AM - 1:00 PM on Saturdays and Sundays.

### TIRE PICKUP WEEK

Outagamie County has authorized the Village of Kimberly to collect tires from residential households (NO Business generated tires) during the week of September 15<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup> at no charge. The Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, but tires cannot be larger than 16" passenger vehicle tires.

### YARD WASTE

Monday, October 20<sup>th</sup> through Friday, October 24<sup>th</sup> will be our **Fall Yard Waste Pick-up**. Garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 6" in length) will be picked up. Yard waste must be put in a plastic bag or in a non-cardboard container, not to exceed 50 lbs.

Clearly mark all containers **"YARD WASTE"** so they can be distinguished from garbage. Pick up will start on the west-end of the village. Once a street has been picked up, they **will not** return! Have all materials on the curb by 7:00 AM. Yard waste stickers are not required during this week.

## STREET DEPARTMENT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### When is brush picked up?

Brush is collected every Thursday, weather permitting. Brush will ONLY get picked up if the property owner calls the Street/Park Department at 788-7507 by 4:30 pm on Wednesday, the week you have brush. NO advanced call - NO pick up.

### What is considered rubbish and when does it get picked up?

Rubbish is basically considered to be "White Goods" (stoves, washers, dryers, dehumidifiers, water heaters, refrigerators and metal items). Rubbish is collected every Friday, weather permitting. As of June 1, 2002 the Village implemented a fee for the pick up of large appliances and large metal items. Appliances that have refrigeration coils (freon) in them such as: refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers will cost \$15.00 for pick up. All other appliances such as: washers/dryers, stoves, water heaters, microwave, and large metal items will cost \$10.00 for pick up. Large metal items would include items such as: swing sets, clothes line poles, lawn mowers, grills, car parts, snow blowers, cast iron tubs/sinks, etc. A sticker will need to be purchased at the Street Department or Clerk's office and applied to the item for pick up. The property owner still needs to notify the street department at 788-7507 by 4:30pm on THURSDAY for Friday pick up unless they have scheduled pickup date at time of purchasing sticker.

### How does garbage get collected?

Garbage must be put out only on your specified day of collection and not more than 14 hours in advance. **Containers cannot be larger than 32 gallons or smaller than 5 gallons, and the top of the container must be larger than the bottom with two (2) handles to facilitate dumping.** Plastic bags must be of heavy material, no less than 4 milliliters. **Total weight of the container shall not exceed 50 lbs.** During the winter, garbage placed on top of snow banks will not be collected. For safety reasons, all garbage must be set at ground level, either by shoveling a place in the terrace or by setting the garbage containers in the driveway apron.



### How do I dispose of carpeting and carpet pad?

Carpeting and carpet pad must be cut into 4ft lengths, rolled, tied and placed in your regular garbage.

### What about mailboxes?

Curbside mailboxes are the responsibility of the property owner and have nothing to do with the Village of Kimberly. If the mailbox is placed in the terrace area, which is within the Village street right of way, there is set back requirement. The face of the mailbox must be 6" behind the back of curb. The height of the mailbox is dictated by the Post Office (42" from top of curb to bottom of mailbox). Both the Post Office and Street Department have specifications for the installation of mailboxes. During the winter months and depending on the amount of accumulated snow, the Village will try to maintain snow plowing to the curb. If weather prevents this, it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep their mailbox clear of snow to facilitate mail delivery.

### What can I do with building materials?

The Village of Kimberly **DOES NOT** pick up building materials (wood, plaster, windows, doors, siding, roofing, concrete, dirt, etc.). It is the responsibility of the property owner to get rid of all building materials, which can be hauled to the Outagamie County Landfill.

### What and when is yard waste?

Yard waste is considered material such as garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 6" in length) from your property. The Village provides a pick up in the spring of the year, as well as the fall of the year, at no cost. During the months of May through September Property owners need to purchase a yard waste sticker for each bag. Pick up is the third Friday of the month and **MUST** be set out by 7:00 am for pick up. Yard waste stickers are a dollar per sticker and available at the Street/Parks Dept. and the Municipal Complex. The village **DOES NOT** pick up grass clippings.
