President's Point of View

The State, Sewers and Thanks; Oh the Diversity of Municipal Government

I am hopeful that your New Year is off to a pleasant start and that you are able to focus on the future, negating the biting cold of winter with pleasant thoughts of spring. Our days at the Municipal Complex are filled with activity and change, but once again we find ourselves being maligned by the State resulting in an interesting array of activity.

Here is some of what is taking place....

As the state government returns to Madison to begin the posturing for preparing the budget, the blame game returns with numerous "studies" and "polls" being shared in an effort to "sell" us a bill of goods regarding the spending habits of local units of government compared to those of the state government. The Speaker of the State legislature is trying his level best to pass TABOR - a change in the Wisconsin constitution, and in an effort to get his pet piece of legislation off the ground, he has created a myth that the spending "problem" is not at the state level but at the local level. I disagree with this notion as your Village Board, department heads, and employees take fiscal management very seriously and work hard to deliver quality services at the very lowest cost possible. We are very active in sharing services to reduce costs, yet newspaper articles say differently. I challenge the legislators in Madison to compare spending with us; I will proudly share the good news of our joint ventures with Little Chute, Appleton, the KASD, Buchanan, Combined Locks and Kaukauna. We will continue to work at reducing costs with such things as automated trash pick up and department sharing similar to our weights and measures

agreement with the City of Appleton. I apologize for the rant, but I am tired that the true story is not being shared. To support this cause, I have been asked, and eagerly accepted, to serve the Wisconsin League of Municipalities as a Lobby Corps member. Four times per year, I will be in Madison sharing our views face to face with other elected local officials from around the state. I will keep you updated on the progress we make!

It wouldn't be an article from me without an update on sewers. Our work continues to focus on improving the infrastructure that you DON'T see and all too often take for granted. We are working with the Heart of The Valley Metropolitan Sewerage District and their engineers to reduce, by 30%, our Inflow and Infiltration (clear water entering sewers and flowing to treatment plant). While

the Village has been very active in removing I & I, we are in need of replacing many pipes underground which have simply aged beyond their useful life and are a problem. This includes the laterals which go from your homes to the connections at the main. Past practice has been to urge residents to replace their laterals; future practice will be to include this as a part of sewer update projects. You will receive more information when the Village Board creates a comprehensive policy for sewer and lateral replacements. These actions will reduce treating clear water which is costly and, if left unchecked, would result in the need for multi-million dollar expansion to the sewage plant. Feel free to ask any questions as we move ahead with this issue in our community.

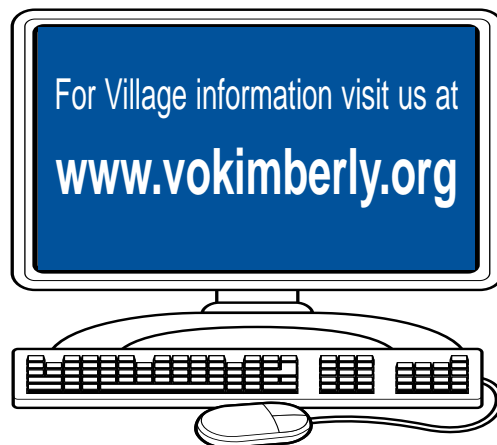

RECYCLING REMINDERS

•

Be sure recycling containers are placed curbside either in the apron or a shoveled area that is easily accessible to the collector. **DO NOT** place recycling bins on top of or behind snow banks. Also keep recycling 4 feet from the polycart if your garbage and recycling is picked up on the same day.

• Recyclable plastic, glass, tin and aluminum (commingle materials) can be placed curbside mixed together in a reusable container. You do not need to separate these materials for collection. Do not mix paper with commingle materials.

• Paper can be set out for recycling in paper bags, in a cardboard box no larger than 3' X 3' X 1' or a reusable container. Cardboard should be broke down to 3' X 3' or less and can be bundled together with twine or tape.

• Reusable containers must be between 15 and 33 gallons with handles on the outside. One for commingle materials and one for paper/cardboard. TO INSURE THE SAFETY OF THE COLLECTOR, ALL CONTAINERS MUST WEIGH LESS THAN 50 POUNDS WHEN SET CURBSIDE. Containers must also be marked with an Outagamie County Recycling Sticker which can be picked up at our office.

• Shredded paper can be recycled. To keep it from blowing, place shredded paper in a brown paper bag and tape or staple the bag shut, and then place it with the rest of your paper recycling.

STREET DEPARTMENT

SPRING YARD WASTE CLEAN UP April 18-April 29

The Street Department will pick up materials from raking and yard clean up as follows:

- Residents may rake this material to the terrace (**not into the gutter**), for pick up.
- Material can be placed in plastic bags or garbage cans, not to exceed 50 lbs.
- **Cardboard boxes CANNOT be used.**
- **No Grass Clippings!**
- Any shrub clippings, less than 6", can be mixed with this material.
- Branches longer than 6" require a special pick up on Thursdays. Residents must call 788-7507, by 4:30 PM on Wednesday to schedule a Thursday pick-up.

In addition to the Spring Yard Waste Clean Up, the Village will pick up shrub trimmings (not to exceed 6"), lawn edgings, and weeds on the *3rd Friday of each month, from May to October*.

This material must be placed in plastic bags with a special sticker attached to each bag. These stickers are available at the Street Department and Village Clerk's Office for \$1.00 each.

FREE TIRE PICK UP

Outagamie County has authorized the Village of Kimberly to collect tires from residential households (NO business generated tires) during the week of April 18th - 22nd at no charge. The Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, but tires cannot be larger than 16" passenger vehicle tires.

APPLIANCE/METAL PICK-UP REMINDER

On June 1, 2002 the Village implemented a fee for the pick up of large appliances and large metal items. An appliance pick up sticker needs to be purchased at the Street Department or Clerk's Office and applied to the item for pick up. Per Village ordinance appliances set out for disposal without a sticker are in violation of municipal ordinance and are subject to a fine. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated and in doing so you are contributing to the beautification of your community.

Appliances that have refrigeration coils (freon) in them such as: refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers cost is \$15.00 for pick up. All other appliances and metal items such as: washers/dryers, stoves, water heaters, microwaves, and large metal items cost is \$10.00 for pick up.

Phillips Fund for the Kimberly Amphitheater

The Village of Kimberly extends their appreciation to Bob and Shirley Phillips for creating the “*Phillips’ Fund for the Kimberly Amphitheater.*” They created an open designated endowment fund with the *Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region* with their contribution of \$10,000. This fund will support Kimberly Amphitheater maintenance, caretaking, improvements and replacement.

Bob was involved with the design, fund raising and construction of the Amphitheater. In announcing the formation of this fund, he expressed his pleasure with the utilization of the facility and management by the Kimberly Amphitheater Board of Directors. “*The group has done a great job of utilizing the facility and providing entertainment, such as Sunday at the Amphitheater. We hope this fund insures that this will continue in the future.*”

Automated Garbage Collection Reminders

Thank You to all residents for your continued cooperation in making the automated collection work in the Village of Kimberly. After 4 months of collection all is going well. There are a few reminders related to automated collection:

- All containers **MUST** be out by 6:00 AM the morning of your collection or the night before and removed within 24 hours after collection.
- Covers **MUST** be closed at least half way, whenever possible covers should be completely closed. This will help facilitate dumping as well as keeping the debris inside the container while dumping. The cover should not be completely open. (please see photos)
- Containers **MUST** be placed 4 feet from any other object. The automated truck needs 4 feet of clearance on either side in order to pick up the poly cart. (please see photos)
- Remember to **RECYCLE** appropriate materials. In most cases, when the Street department monitors containers, we have found that when residents don't recycle they often do not have enough room in their containers for their normal garbage.

Citizens Police Academy

The Fox Valley Metro Police Department is sponsoring a Citizens Police Academy on March 5th, 2005. This session is a ONE DAY course running from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM that informs citizens on how the Police Department operates. It will cover topics such as traffic law, investigations, defensive tactics, firearms, crime prevention and more.

The Academy is open to persons who are 16 years of age or older with no criminal record. Preference will be given to people who live or work in Little Chute, Kimberly or the Kimberly Area School District. There is no cost to attend the Citizen Police Academy other than your time. We think you will find it a worth while investment. Lunch will be provided.

Crime Prevention

The Police Department would like to remind the residents of Kimberly to lock their vehicles, homes, and garage doors to take away the opportunity to become a victim of crime. Communities can and do gain a reputation with criminals if the area is an easy target. In cooperation with the community, the Police Department is going to do its best to help prevent residents from becoming a victim. We must also call on the community to be involved in this active role against crime. Helping to remove the **opportunity** can greatly deter the, would be, criminal.

Village Ordinances

Ordinance 7-1-6 (c) (1) Animals Running at Large

No person having in their possession or ownership any animal or fowl shall allow the same to run at large within the Village. The owner of any animal, whether licensed or unlicensed, shall keep their animal tied or enclosed in a proper enclosure so as not to allow said animal to interfere with the passing public or neighbors. Any animal running at large unlicensed and required by state law or Village Ordinance to be licensed, shall be seized and impounded by a humane or Village Ordinance officer.

Ordinance 10-1-28 (a) Parking of Vehicles Over 12,000 Pounds or 16 Feet Restricted

No person owning or having control of any truck, trailer, truck power unit, tractor, bus or recreation vehicle with a tare or empty weight in excess of twelve thousand (12,000) pounds gross weight, or over sixteen (16) feet in length (including accessories, racks, or other physical extensions), or having a height of more than eight (8) feet from the roadway, shall park the same upon any street, avenue, or public way in the Village of Kimberly in a residential-zoned area between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or for more than one hour between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. This does not apply to unloading or loading of goods or merchandise.

Ordinance 11-3-5 Storage Of Junk, ETC., Regulated

No person shall store junk or discarded property including automobiles, automobile parts, trucks, or tractors, refrigerators, furnaces, washing machines, stoves, machinery or machinery parts, wood, bricks, cement blocks or other unsightly debris which substantially depreciates property values in the neighborhood except or upon permit issued by the Village Board. The Chief of Police may require by written order any premises violating this Section to be put in compliance within the time specified in such order and, if the order is not complied with, may have the premises put in compliance and the cost thereof assessed as a special tax against the property.

- The picture book and reader's section has been expanded along with lounge seating areas for parents.
- The office for the children's librarians is now occupying the former story time room, and story time will take place in an open area next to this room.

If you need assistance finding something in the newly arranged space, please let us know.

Plans are underway for another fun-filled summer reading program. Information will appear in the Summer *Park & Recreation* Booklet, and will be sent to all of the students in public and parochial schools in the school district in March. The theme for the children's program is "*Dragons, Dreams, and Daring Deeds*". The theme for the young adult and adult programs is "*Joust Read*".

Thank you to all of you who have used and enjoyed the library in the past year. Whether you use the resources of the library in person or via the library's website, your business is greatly appreciated. In 2004 the website experienced a huge leap of activity going from an average monthly use of about 4000 to almost 8000 users per month. Final numbers are not yet available on the number of items checked out of the library, but initial indications are that use of the library's materials increased as well.

Building Permit Information

Homeowners in the Village of Kimberly may wonder what projects require permits. The following require issuance of a permit prior to commencement of work:

Construction of any building – this category includes; houses, garages, sheds and any structure that forms an enclosure.

Additions to buildings, porches, decks, etc.

Remodeling – this category includes; siding, entry doors, windows, etc. (Does not include painting or carpeting).

Heating and Ventilating: - All replacement systems
 - All installations of heating systems including fireplaces
 - All installations of central air conditioning
 - Any change in fuel source

Electric System – All work on the electric system must be performed by a licensed electrician, who is registered with the Village of Kimberly.

Plumbing – All plumbing must be performed by a State of Wisconsin licensed plumber.
 (Plumbing & Electrical Exception: the owner of a single family residence, owned and occupied by the owner as the owner's home, may perform the work within that home; however, a permit must be issued for such work and inspections are necessary).

Miscellaneous Permits – Permits are also required for the following:

Moving Buildings	Swimming Pools	Hot Tubs	Sheds

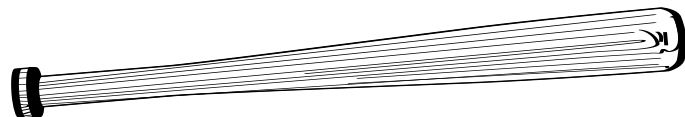

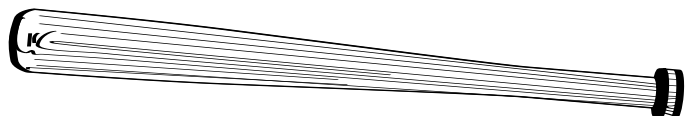


Fireworks Sponsors Sought

YOUR SUMP PUMP AFFECTS EVERYONE

The Village is constantly working to remove clear water from the sanitary system. Clear water entering the sanitary system is monitored by the Heart of the Valley Metropolitan Sewer District; and when flows exceed the norm, the HOVMSD calculates the extra flow and imposes additional fees upon the Village. These additional fees are passed on to the homeowner through increased sewer user fees.

Spring is the most important time of the year to have a sump pump that works correctly. With the snow melting and the frost in the ground changing from ice to water, the ground around your home becomes saturated. Add the spring rains to the equation and the foundation drain that surrounds a basement becomes very active. The water accumulating in this underground tube is directed into your sump pit. When full, the sump pump discharges the water to a storm water system (available in many neighborhoods) or to the lawn. This water eventually makes it's way to the Fox River. If all is working as designed the basement will remain dry and comfortable.

However there are many homes that have sump pumps that work as intended but discharge the water to the wrong sewer system. If the sump pump is discharging to a floor or sink drain in your basement it is contributing clean, clear water to the wrong system.

If during the Spring thaw, right after heavy, or long periods of rain, the sump pump does not activate more frequently, the foundation drain system may have a cross connection. These cross connections in most cases direct the water to the sanitary sewer system. When this happens it costs every homeowner in our Village money. When reading about overflows at the HOVMSD and the need to dump raw sewage into the Fox River, this is because too much clean, clear water is in the system. By making sure the sump pump is working properly and discharging the water to the correct sewer, residents can rest assured that they are doing their part to save money, and help the environment.

Anyone who is unsure where their sump pump water is going, may contact the Building Inspector (788-7500).

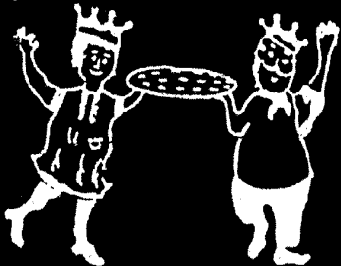
