Monday evenings have yielded some interesting things since the last issue of Kim Talk. In no particular order, allow me to share some things that have transpired....

The former K-Mart property is being redeveloped!! GGV (the developer) has worked with the Village Board and staff to create a TIF district to transform the crumbling asphalt and rusting building into a vibrant new condo-style neighborhood. Activity at the site should be underway as you receive this newsletter.

A new sanitary sewer policy has been adopted in yet another effort to reduce the amount of clear water infiltrating the sewer system. The new policy calls for the replacement of laterals when sewer mains are replaced. While this certainly has a cost associated with it, the long term impact should be a positive one for all of us.

Work has been done in creating a storm water utility. This has taken place to comply with another UNFUNDED mandate from the EPA and the State of Wisconsin DNR. The creation of this storm water utility is to target the removal of solids from storm water through use of: detention areas, increased street cleaning, and ongoing communication and education for all of us on how to best reduce the run off of pollutants. Please watch for more information on this issue in the coming months.

A few Mondays ago, the boardroom was blessed with probably the best sounding Pledge of Allegiance, as the entire Kimberly Fire Department was on hand in their dress blues for the swearing in of our new Fire Chief, Bob Van Thiel. This is just a sample of what takes place on your behalf each Monday night starting at six o'clock; feel free to join us, your input is always welcomed.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE/EVENTS

AUTOMATED GARBAGE COLLECTION UPDATE

Please note: Occasionally due to employee training or equipment breakdown it is possible that the garbage route may not get completed on the scheduled day. If this occurs please leave your poly cart out and it will be emptied as soon as possible.

Automated Garbage collection went very well this winter. However, there are a number of reminders:

With the winter parking restrictions lifted, residents are reminded to watch where cars are parked in relationship to where the poly cart is placed. If the drivers cannot reach the poly cart, the container cannot be emptied. If a container cannot be emptied on your scheduled collection day, it will not get emptied that week.

Large Item Collection:

Large items consist of those (non-metal) items that are too large to fit in the poly cart such as: chairs, televisions, couches, rolled and tied mattress, carpet rolled and tied in 4' lengths not exceeding 50 lbs.

Overflow garbage which does not fit in your poly cart on a given week will not be picked up. When cleaning a garage or basement, excess may need to be hauled to the landfill.

Large Item pick-up will occur on the last collection day of the month.

Large Items must be set out on the terrace and not in the alley.

Building and/or landscaping materials including wooden fence, railroad ties, wood chips, decorative rock, concrete, dirt, windows, siding, roofing, and plaster will not be picked up.

Metal Items:

Metal items such as: bikes, grills, appliances, and other metal items require the purchase of a sticker at the Village Clerk's Office or the Street Department Office by Thursday for a Friday pick-up.

Computers contain heavy metals cannot be disposed of with your garbage. They need to be brought to the Outagamie County Clean Sweep Program.

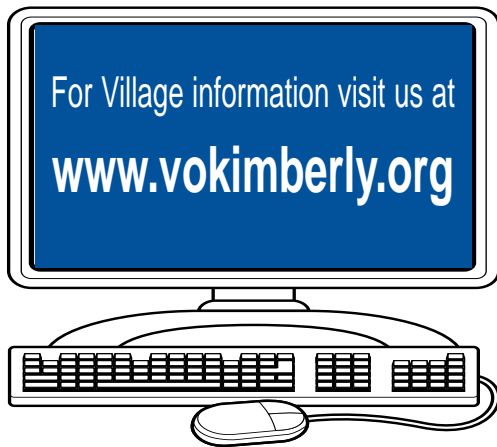

KIMBERLY WATER DEPARTMENT

The Kimberly Water Department is pleased to present the 2004 Annual Quality Water Report. This report is designed to inform customers about the quality water and services delivered to them every day. The constant goal is to provide a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. The Kimberly Water Department continually strives to improve the water treatment process, protect our water resources, and to ensure the quality of the water. The source of our water is ground water, which is pumped through three wells, from the Cambrian Sandstone Aquifer.

*The Kimberly Water Department is pleased to report that our drinking water is **safe** and meets federal and state requirements.*

Anyone with questions or concerns about this report or the water utility may contact Water Superintendent Rob Klein at 788-7510. We want our valued customers to be informed about their water utility. Anyone wishing to learn more about the Village's water utility is invited to attend the regularly scheduled Water Commission meetings, which are held on the last Tuesday of the month at 4:30 PM in the Kimberly Municipal Council Chambers.

The Kimberly Water Department routinely monitors for constituents in the drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2004.

In this table there are many terms and abbreviations a layperson may not be familiar with. To help better understand these terms the following definitions are provided:

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) – one part per million correspond to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter – one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) – picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.

Action Level (AL) – the concentration of a contaminant, which if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements, which a water system must follow.

Maximum Contaminant Level – The “Maximum Allowed” (MCL) is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal – The “Goal” (MCLG) is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

As indicated on the table on the next page, our system did not have any violations. The drinking water in Kimberly meets or exceeds all Federal and State requirements. As the result of monitoring and testing, some constituents have been detected but the EPA has determined that our water IS SAFE at these levels.

Infants and young children are typically more vulnerable to lead in drinking water than the general population. It is possible that lead levels at your

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Water Meter Removal

The Kimberly Water Department reminds Village residents that when replacing siding or performing maintenance to the exterior of the house, to contact the Kimberly Water Department to remove and reinstall your water meter. There is no charge for this service, and allows for an inspection of the meter and the wiring into the residence. A \$25.00 fee will be charged to the property owner if the water meter outside register is removed or tampered with by anyone other than the Water Department.

home may be higher than at other homes in the community as a result of materials used in your home's plumbing. Anyone concerned about elevated lead levels in their home's water may wish to have their water tested, or flush your tap 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using tap water. Additional information is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (1-800-426-4791).

All drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects is available by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The Kimberly Water Department works around the clock to provide top quality water to every tap, and asks that all our customers help protect our water sources, which are the heart of our community, our way of life, and our children's future.

STREET DEPARTMENT

REFUSE PICK-UP

The Village DOES NOT pick up building materials (siding, roofing material, windows, dry wall, concrete, dirt, etc.) at any time. Property owners must dispose of these materials at the Outagamie County Landfill located on Holland Road in Little Chute.

The Village DOES NOT pick up lead acid type batteries such as: car batteries or recreational vehicle batteries. These batteries can be brought to the drop off sight located at the Outagamie County Recycling Center on Holland Road in Little Chute.

Dog duty and cat litter must be wrapped & rolled in newsprint before being set out for garbage pick-up.

The Village DOES NOT pick up LP tanks. The only way that we know how to get rid of LP tanks are to trade them in when you buy a new one or release the remaining gas, remove the valve and take it to the Outagamie County Landfill for a \$5.00 fee

BRUSH PICK UP

Brush which is longer than 6" and not more than 4" in diameter needs to be called in by 4:30 pm on WEDNESDAY for a Thursday pick up.

YARD WASTE PICKUP

Yard Waste (lawn edgings and weeds) will be picked up on the 3rd Friday of each month from May through October. This material must be placed in a plastic bag with a special Yard Waste Sticker attached. These stickers are available at the Street Department Office and the Clerks Office at a cost of \$1.00 per sticker. No grass clippings will be picked up at any time.



WEED NOTICE

Pursuant to the Village of Kimberly Code of Ordinances, notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the Village of Kimberly, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin, to destroy all noxious weeds and to cut or remove the accumulation or growth of weeds, grass, brush, or other rank or offensive vegetation which has grown to a height greater than eight (8) inches.

There has been a change in Village Ordinance as of March 18, 2002. It will now cost a resident a minimum of \$75.00 per hour, plus equipment usage. A minimum of one hour will be charged to cut noxious weeds or grass 8" or longer.

TREE CARE

New trees, which will be planted throughout the Village, need care. Please water these trees with five (5) gallons every 4 to 5 days during dry spells.

When mowing and trimming around trees, please avoid hitting the base of the tree. There are quite a few terrace trees with bark torn from the base, due to mowing and trimming too close to the tree. If this occurs too often, there is a good chance the tree will die. When a terrace tree dies, the replacement time could take up to 5 years, due to commitments in other areas of the community.

REMINDER

Grass cutting time is here. Please refrain from blowing grass out into the streets. Grass can clog up storm sewer catch basins, which doesn't allow the street to drain properly. Water that drains from the street and into storm sewers ends up in the river, along with all the grass clippings. Grass clippings also hold fertilizer and pesticides that contaminate streams, rivers, and lakes. The DNR encourages leaving grass clippings on your lawn. They can act as good nutrients, as well as composting your lawn clippings.

STORM WATER UTILITY

The Village of Kimberly is currently in the development stages of creating a Storm Water Utility. This is a new venture for Kimberly, although most communities surrounding us have had storm water utilities for many years. We hope to have the utility in place by this summer.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources are requiring all local units of government to remove 40% of the total suspended solids (TSS) from our storm water by 2013. As you probably know, the storm drains you see along village streets collect storm water, and discharge this water into the Fox River. As this water flows to the catch basins, it brings with it all of the dirt and grime which is washed into the street from adjoining properties, and from the roadway itself. A Storm Water Utility is a means by which we will develop ponds and settling basins to remove the solids from the storm water. As with all projects of this type, we will be forced to assess a charge to everyone in the community to conduct this TSS removal. The fees will be collected on the current water and sewer utility billing, and be turned over to the Storm Water Utility. Unfortunately, when the EPA and DNR require local communities to implement such programs, they do not help finance these expensive projects.

We will also be publishing some educational information for the general public to help educate everyone on how the Storm Water Utility will work, and how the ecology is affected by storm water discharges. Over the years, we have witnessed people dumping all sorts of nasties into catch basins. The sad thing is, what ever we put into the storm sewer flows directly to our Fox River. And whatever people upriver from us dump into their catch basins ends up in the Fox River as it flows through Kimberly. As Kimberly continues to improve the access to the Fox River along Sunset Park, we will also now improve the quality of the Fox River itself.

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PORTABLE SWIMMING POOLS

Owners of portable swimming pools are reminded that if your pool holds water that is 24 inches deep or deeper you are required to provide protection around the pool.

Protection of a swimming pool that is 24 inches deep requires an adequate four foot high fence, or a pool cover capable of supporting 100 pounds per square foot of area. The cover must be in place at all times when the pool is not in use.

It is also required that all pools of this depth be equipped with a filtration system to assure proper circulation to keep bacteria at a minimum.

Pool placement is also governed by Village Ordinance. The pool cannot be placed in the front yard set back area. When placed on your lot the pool must be a minimum of 3 feet from rear and side yard lot lines.

Last summer several residents were contacted regarding the lack of protection surrounding this style of swimming pool. This summer owners of unprotected swimming pools will be contacted to install protection or remove the pool. If no action is taken the owner will receive a citation from the Metro Police Department.

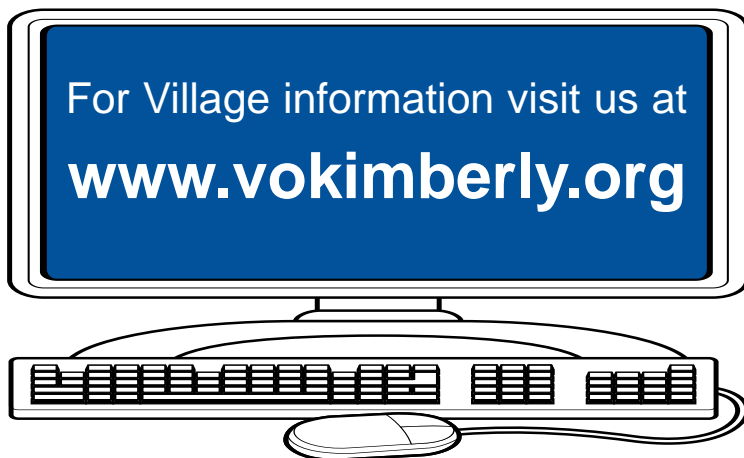

Plans are underway for another fun-filled summer reading program. The theme for the children's program is "*Dragons, Dreams, and Daring Deeds*" and for the young adult and adult program is "*Joust Read.*" The youth librarians will be visiting all elementary and middle schools (public and parochial) during the month of May to promote the summer's reading activities. The date for the biennial book sale is set for August 16 & 17 at the Kimberly Municipal Building. The *Friends of the Library* are sponsoring the book sale and further information will be sent to the local newspapers as the date gets closer.

In 2004 the library's website experienced a huge leap of activity going from an average of 4000 to almost 8000 users per month. 2005 has seen continued growth with numbers quickly approaching 10,000 users per month. Final numbers for calendar year 2004 show that use of the library's materials continues to increase:

- ★ 277,595 items checked out of the libraries
- ★ 27,372 items sent to us to fill requests for materials from other libraries
- ★ 27,291 items sent to other libraries to fill their requests
- ★ 129,717 visits to the libraries by the public
- ★ 13,358 people attended programs sponsored by the joint library

Thank you to all who have used the library resources in person or via the library's website in the past year. Your business is greatly appreciated.

As a reminder: items returned to the library after it closes for the day are not checked in until the start of the next business day. Overdue charges will apply as of the date an item is checked in. On occasion there may be a misunderstanding about returning an item due on a given date after the library closes. Because staff is not there to check it in, it is considered to be late and will be checked in the next business day. To ensure that something is checked in on its due date, it must be returned while the library is open, renewed in person, by telephone, or online. Please note that online renewals may be done until midnight to get credit for any given day.
