### President's POINT OF VIEW

## Imagine...A look into the future of our Fox Cities home

On October 2nd, I attended a summit to learn of the findings from surveys and some eighty listening sessions held throughout the communities that make up the Fox Cities region. You may have already heard about this community visioning project known as "Imagine Fox Cities". I was a part of listening sessions which were focused on understanding levels of "well-being" and to discern what "vision" was held for our children's grandchildren if they choose to call the Fox Cities home. I have found this process to be enlightening and the summit to be educational and inspiring. I walked away with a feeling about what a good place we CAN be here yet understanding that we have work to do to fulfill the shared vision.

"What can we be if we are intentional about it?" This opening line of the summit from Co-Chair Beth Flaherty really set the tone for excellent discussion throughout the day long meeting with more than three hundred participants. We then dove head on into dissecting what input was shared in the listening sessions and surveys and I was reminded that we all need to "listen to what is true for others." In this lesson, I was reminded that my lens may be narrow in its focus and if we are truly looking ahead for

our children's grandchildren, we need to expand our collective vision. We need to be using our civic muscle to include more people in decision making, ask more questions, and have a deeper understanding of topics that impact the view of "well-being" for all who call the Fox Cities home. For us to be intentional about the future, we need to dig deeper into those things that diminish the feeling of well-being. Whether that be more aggressive approaches to stemming opioid issues, more education on mental health issues, or engaging our youth in helping map our future. I learned of a youth driven initiative happening in nearby Algoma which identified a purpose with a question: "how can kids go hungry" which launched a community-based food bank and cradle to career programming. The call it, Live Healthy, Live Well, Live Algoma. This learning has me yearning to invite ad-hoc youth board members in our community. As we discussed the future, we talked of diversity and changing neighborhoods, we talked of health care and what can be done to keep people OUT of hospitals and health care facilities. We talked about preserving the tremendous resources here, including trail systems, the Fox River, the cultural amenities and the sense of being neighborly.

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## 2020 ELECTIONS FOR KIMBERLY

**February 18, 2020 – Spring Primary**, if required to reduce the number of candidates on the Spring Ballot.

### **April 7, 2020 – Spring Election and Presidential Preference Primary**

The following municipal offices are to be elected.

\***Village President** (1)- 2 year term (incumbent: President Chuck Kuen)

\***Village Trustee** (3) – 2 year term (incumbents: Dave Hietpas; Marcia Trentlage; and Mike Hruzek)



Other Offices to be elected include: WI Supreme Court; County Board; and Kimberly School Board.

Candidate paperwork for the Village Board can be picked up in the Clerk's Office. The first day to circulate nomination papers is December 1, 2019. The final day for filing nomination papers is **5:00 PM, on Thursday, January 2, 2020**, in the office of the Village Clerk.

### **November 3, 2020 – General Election**

**Update your voter registration (new voter / new address / new name)** at least 20 days before an election in order to be pre-printed in the regular poll book. Complete the paperwork at the Village Clerk's Office or register online using [www.myvote.wi.gov](http://www.myvote.wi.gov). You will need proof of residency that states your current name and current address – WI license/ID, utility bill, bank statement or credit card statement, or government document works best. Call if you need more options. **PLEASE REGISTER EARLY. IF YOU WAIT UNTIL ELECTION DAY, ALLOW AT LEAST AN HOUR AS LINES ARE LONG FOR REGISTRATION.**

**Need to vote absentee?** Absentee Ballot Applications can be found at [www.myvote.wi.gov](http://www.myvote.wi.gov) or by emailing [jmicke@vokimberly.org](mailto:jmicke@vokimberly.org). A copy of your photo ID must be included with your application for a ballot, if we DO NOT have it on file already. Apply early to ensure your ballot is sent and returned in time to be counted on Election Day!

**In office Absentee voting will be available the TWO WEEKS prior to the election.** The Monday before an election is closed for both absentee voting and registration.

You can see a demonstration of the machines during the Public Test held the Tuesday before each Election Day. Watch for the Notice in the Times Villager.

# STREET DEPARTMENT

## Garbage & Recycling Reminders for Winter and the Upcoming Holidays

- The days for **Bulky, Non-Metal Collection** were changed one year ago to **Monday and Wednesday** for the designated week each month. Please reference the 2019 and 2020 Garbage and Recycling Calendars for the collection dates for your address. This change was made to assist in providing adequate staffing throughout the week for other duties.
- Polycarts CANNOT be placed in the road or on top of snow piles
- The polycart MUST be placed at ground level either on the terrace or in the driveway. Polycarts which are placed in the road for pick up, during winter months, are subject to be plowed over and damaged. Replacement of damaged carts are the responsibility of the property owner at the cost of \$73.50.
- The Village DOES NOT pick up overflow garbage. Excess garbage generated due to the holidays must be disposed of by the renter or property owner. This can be done by spreading your overflow garbage over a couple of week's collection, asking a neighbor if they have room in their polycart, or by hauling the overflow garbage to the landfill.
- Wrapping paper is NOT recyclable. This must be placed in your regular garbage collection.

## Winter Driving

- Remember to slow down and drive with extra caution during the winter season. Allow more time for your trips to school, work, and shopping.
- The Village will maintain the street pavement as best they can. This does not mean the pavement will be completely free of snow and ice.
- There will always be situations where snow and/or ice build-up will occur on our streets and intersections especially early in the morning or later in the evening when the sun sets, as temperatures drop.
- Allow extra room when following other vehicles, approach intersections with extra caution, and assume your vehicle will not stop as fast as it does on dry pavement.
- Remain at least 200 ft behind snow plows and spreaders.

## Snow Removal

- Village ordinance 430-10 states that it is unlawful to shovel, blow, or plow snow onto or across Village streets or alleys. Citations will be issued to habitual offenders.
- Salt barrels placed at specific intersections are to be used for emergency use only. These salt barrels are not provided for residents for their own application. Salt for sidewalks and driveways should be purchased at local retail outlets.
- Corner lot owners are asked to keep a path open through the crosswalks, the Village crew will clear the remainder of snow as time permits.
- Anyone with a fire hydrant near his or her property is asked to help keep the snow cleared from around it. This will allow for quick response time if ever the fire department needs to access the hydrant.
- Snow must be cleared from the sidewalks within 24 hours after each snowfall. If ice builds up, it must be removed or treated with a melting agent. It is Village policy to address unshoveled sidewalks only when a complaint has been filed. Village officials do not go out looking for sidewalks that need shoveling. No written or verbal notice will be given to violators per ordinance 430-10.

## Sidewalk Replacement

The Village Board has an ongoing sidewalk rehabilitation program to provide safe walking surfaces for pedestrians. The primary concern is whether the sidewalk presents a hazardous or potentially hazardous condition to pedestrians, bicycles, infant stroller, etc. Appearance of the sidewalk has no bearing whatsoever on its replacement or acceptability. Such conditions as discoloring, minor cracks, checking, negative sloping (away from the curb), minor settling without displacement, etc. are not caused for replacement. Following is the list of criteria for replacement of sidewalk blocks:

- $\frac{3}{4}$ " vertical differential in sidewalk blocks.
- Settled out of vertical alignment (more than 1" per foot from normal grade).
- Having a crack  $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide.
- Settlement in abutting cracks or blocks that trap water.
- Broken corners and or surface lacerations in which concrete is popped out and creates surface depressions causing a safety hazard (multiple cracks).
- Sidewalk that has protruding structures over 1" (trees, poles, etc.)
- Drop of edges

All sidewalks will be marked for replacement with the intent of pouring up to a structurally sound adjoining concrete block.

## New Extended Hours:

In effort to move toward meeting Wisconsin Library Standards we have extended library hours and added public internet stations. The Wisconsin Public Library Standards program is a self-evaluation tool. The purpose of this voluntary program for Wisconsin public libraries and librarians is to encourage the ongoing development of quality library service in the state by providing public libraries with a tool to identify strengths, recognize areas for improvement, and assist libraries in gaining community support.

Our goal is to provide great library service in effort to inspire and support lifelong learning and the love of reading. We use the Wisconsin Standards as a guide to measure our services against peer libraries in the state. We are currently focusing on improving access and collections with programs being reviewed constantly.

Our libraries are now open at 8 am Monday through Friday to better serve you. We will also be open at both locations 9 am – 1 pm on Saturdays year-round. The additional hours were made available in part due to the use of self-service options in the library allowing us to staff differently. Your library staff is arriving at 8 am to open the library, please continue to be patient and understanding as it may take a few moments to ready the library for use.

## Scholarship Opportunity:

The Friends of the Library are offering three \$500.00 scholarships. Recipients will be awarded on April 21st, 2020. Qualifications for scholarship require a Friends of the Library Sponsor who has attended no less than two Friends of the Library business meetings in the twelve months prior to the March Friends meeting. Either the sponsor or recipient are required to complete 20 hours of verified volunteer service to the libraries.

There is still a chance to meet the two-meeting minimum November 19th and February 18th. In the spirit of supporting lifelong learning, scholarships must be used for educational purposes however program accreditation is not required.

## Programs:

It might be cold outside, but there will be many hot programs inside! Mark your calendars for our Galaxy Con on December 7, a family-friendly and free convention celebrating your favorite fictional galaxies through trivia, crafts, games, and vendors. November and December will feature our holiday make and take programs including: ugly sweater designing, gingerbread house making and ornament decorating. Also, don't forget to see Elvis John ringing in the holiday season with classic Elvis songs and facts.

Our library is now a Connection Café site! This group meets on the fourth Thursday of the month. Connection Cafés are social engagement programs designed to create and replace lost social connections and reduce isolation. Monthly activities include themed reminiscing, art, music, community service projects and intergenerational programs.

## Yard Waste Drop-Off Site Is Open

Over the summer, the Street Department constructed a Yard Waste Drop-Off Site at the Street Department, 426 W. Kimberly Ave., and it was officially opened to those obtaining the required \$5 annual permit, on Monday, September 30th. The Drop-Off Site is accessed by using the W. Maes Avenue entrance and is open 6:30 am to 8 pm daily, including weekends and holidays.

Residents who have obtained the annual permit may drop off grass trimmings, leaves, flower & vegetable garden waste, nuts, fruits, and small twigs and brush that are not larger than 1/2 inch diameter and 18 inches long. Larger brush is not accepted due to space limitations, but will still be collected with the Village's curb side brush collection service.

This site may be used by village residents living in households that are serviced by the Village refuse collection program (households up to four dwellings.) The drop off site cannot be used for depositing waste generated by commercial lawn, landscape, or tree care businesses, by rental property owners except as identified in the rules, or other businesses.

Permits may be obtained at the Village Municipal Complex at 515 W. Kimberly Avenue or the Street Department at 426 W. Kimberly Avenue. Residents will need to complete the application and provide proof of residency with a current driver license or utility bill. Permits obtained in 2019 will be valid through December 31, 2020.

## Overnight Parking Ban

Per village ordinance, from December 1st to April 1st, vehicles are not permitted to park along village streets between the hours of 2AM and 6AM. Vehicle owners may request permission from the Fox Valley Metro Police Department to leave their vehicle parked on the village streets during this period. Requests need to be emailed to [overnightparking@fvmpd.org](mailto:overnightparking@fvmpd.org) and include the following information: date, registered owner's name, phone number, email address, license plate number, vehicle description, and address where the vehicle will be parked. ## Crossing Guards

The Fox Valley Metro Police Department is currently seeking Crossing Guards and Crossing Guard Substitutes. This is routine outdoor work performed on pre-scheduled and varied shifts in the Villages of Kimberly and Little Chute. Applicants need to pass the background check and be at least 18 years of age with a high school diploma or equivalent. ## PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS

The Clerk's Office will be closed  
**December 24th, December 25th and  
 January 1st for the Holidays.**

Once again for your convenience, **CAPITAL CREDIT UNION**, Kimberly location **ONLY**, will collect taxes for the Village of Kimberly. **ANY RESIDENT**, not just members, can pay their taxes at the Capital location in Kimberly. They offer extended hours and easy drive-through access.

Please pay taxes early to avoid the rush, or use the **PAYMENT DEPOSITORY** located by the west library entrance. **DO NOT** place tax bills or utility payments in the Library Book Return. The **PAYMENT DEPOSITORY** offers additional security and safety measures. Remember, the Library staff **CANNOT** collect tax bills.

# Village of Kimberly Collection Policies

**BRUSH EVERY THURSDAY** – Brush is generally picked up every Thursday between April and November, weather and time permitting. All brush must be 18” or longer, piled neatly on the terrace and all in one direction, no root balls. Residents needing a brush pick-up **MUST** call the Street Department at 788-7507 or email [streets@vokimberly.org](mailto:streets@vokimberly.org) by 2:00 PM Wednesday, for pick-up on Thursday.

**METAL ITEMS EVERY FRIDAY** – An appliance pick up sticker is required. They can be purchased at the Street Department or Clerk’s office and applied to the item for pick up. Per Village ordinance, appliances set out for disposal without a sticker are in violation of municipal ordinance and are subject to a fine.

Appliances that have refrigeration coils (Freon) in them such as: refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers - cost is \$15.00. All other appliances and metal items such as: washers/dryers, stoves, water heaters, microwaves, and miscellaneous metal items - cost is \$10.00.

**LARGE BULKY NON METAL COLLECTION** – Large items consist of those (non-metal) items that are too large to fit in the poly-cart such as: furniture, mattresses, carpet rolled and tied in 4’ lengths and not exceeding 50lbs. Large items cannot be placed on the terrace prior to 24 hours of pick up. This is against Village Ordinance and is subject to a citation, see ordinance listed below. The Village of Kimberly does not pick up building materials and/or landscape materials, including wooden fence, railroad ties, wood chips, concrete, dirt, windows, siding, roofing and/or dry wall. For collection dates see calendar on reverse side.

**YARD WASTE** – Consists of lawn rakings, shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18”), weeds, lawn edgings and garden debris. Yard waste will be picked up from May thru September. This material must be placed in a brown biodegradable paper bag and a special sticker must be attached to each bag. Stickers are available for \$1.00 at the Street Department office and the Clerk’s office. Residents needing a yard waste pick-up must call the Street Department at 788-7507 or email [streets@vokimberly.org](mailto:streets@vokimberly.org) and be placed on a list. All yard waste must be set out on the terrace by 6:00 AM.

During a one week period in the Spring (May) and a one week period in the Fall (October), the Village will provide for the pick-up of all yard waste at no cost. See calendar on the reverse side.

**YARD WASTE DROP OFF SITE** – Open 6:30 AM to 8 PM daily including weekends and holidays, located at 426 W. Kimberly Avenue with entrance on Maes Avenue is now available to residents. No contractors or business generated waste allowed. A \$5.00 ANNUAL PERMIT IS REQUIRED to use this site and can be purchased at the Village Complex or at the Street Department. This site is monitored by security cameras.

**LEAVES** – Leaves will be collected according to existing policy during the seasonal time frame. Generally that starts around October 1st and continues until the third week in November, weather permitting. All leaves must be free of plastic, paper, cardboard, gravel, brush, and dirt. All leaves must be raked onto the terrace for collection. DO NOT rake leaves into the street.

**TIRES** – A free tire pick up will occur in April and September. At no other time will tires be collected. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, but tires cannot be larger than 17” passenger vehicle tires. No business generated tires.

**WASTE OIL & OIL FILTER** - Drop off site is located in the parking lot east of the Street Department. To access site use the driveway on N. James Street.

**TELEVISIONS & ELECTRONICS** – Wisconsin’s New E-waste Law effective 9/1/2010 prohibits the disposal of various devices such as: televisions, computer monitors (both CRT and flat screens), desktop and laptop computers, printers, fax machines, speakers, VCRs, DVD players and digital video recorders, cell phones and phones with video displays. ## Recycling

Place all recycling in the green recycling cart provided. There is no need to separate paper from the glass, aluminum, plastic or tin. Follow the same poly-cart placement information as listed in the Automated Garbage General Rules. ## Automated Garbage General Rules

Weekly collection days in the Village of Kimberly are on Tuesdays, for residents who live north of the railroad tracks and on Fridays for residents who live south of the railroad tracks.

**\*By Ordinance, (Automated Garbage Collection, Village Ordinance 418-6), any items set out for collection must be placed curbside by 6:00 AM on the day of collection or the night before, but not before 5:00 PM. This includes: poly-carts, metal items, and large item collection. Items CAN NOT be set out days or weeks in advance of the regularly scheduled collection date. A citation will be issued. These ordinances are established to keep the community clean, safe, and healthy. All poly-carts must be removed 24 hours after collection. Non compliance of the Village Ordinance 418-6 can result in a fine of \$75.25 for the first offense.**

We recommend that you set your poly-cart on a flat surface; it must be at ground level, near the edge of the curb or at the end of your driveway apron. Make sure the arrows on the polycart lid are facing the road. Containers **MUST** be placed 4 feet from any other object. This includes: recycling, large item pickup, mailboxes, trees, snow piles, parked cars and other poly-carts. If the driver cannot reach the poly-cart, the container cannot be emptied. If the container cannot be emptied on your scheduled collection day, it **WILL NOT** be emptied that week.

All solid garbage must fit into the poly-cart without packing it too tightly. Poly-cart covers are required to be partially closed or completely closed. This will help facilitate dumping as well as keep the debris inside the container until dumped. Any poly-cart which has the cover completely open will not get emptied that week.

The Village of Kimberly does not provide overflow garbage collection. The automated system which uses a poly-cart is designed to collect the average refuse from a residential unit. Residential units having weekly overflow or overflow from garage sales, large gatherings, house cleaning, moving in or out, etc. which is more than the average norm are responsible for disposing of their overflow. This can be done by spreading your overflow garbage over a couple of weeks’ collection, asking a neighbor if they have room in their poly-cart, or by hauling the overflow garbage to the landfill. Property owners of rental properties will ultimately be held responsible. It is the responsibility of the landlords to keep their tenants aware of the Village ordinances and requirements.

## Other Information

**SUMP PUMP DISCHARGE** – Any sump pump discharge, which is not hooked into a mini storm and discharges on your lawn, **MUST** discharge six feet from your property line.

**WINTER PARKING** – There will be no overnight parking in the street from December 1st through April 1st from 2:00 AM - 6:00 AM.

# 2019 A Year of Progress!

Construction and development of the Cedars riverfront redevelopment kicked into high gear through 2019. Many roads have been paved, connections through multi-modal trails and the installation of Treaty Park has occurred! Here's a recap of the highlights and a quick reference to learn more about the progress:

**Rivers Edge Subdivision:** This nearly 20 acre subdivision on the most western edge of the property offers over 40 single family lots and two planned unit developments. In May of 2019 the area was sold to a developer to market, construct and sell all the single family homes and planned development units. The subdivision received concrete roads and additional landscape screening and buffers. The area offers a quiet residential setting with amazing river views!

**Riverfront Developments:** In the future as you travel along Papermill Run from the west side to the east side several luxury apartment units are under construction! The Ebb and Flow structures have started and anticipated completion is set for the Summer of 2020. The Oasis, another structure located at the end of Sidney Street has ramped up construction. This luxury apartment complex will be complete in the Spring of 2020. Midwest Expansion will also be converting a former mill structure into a restaurant experience located just north of the Main Street cul-de-sac. This restaurant will offer riverfront dining and views of the Fox. The Village is working together with the Developer to create a scenic overlook between the restaurant and the dam. The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation awarded the Village with \$250,000 in June of 2019 for the construction of the overlook feature! Concepts are currently being designed and construction is anticipated to begin in 2020.

**Main Mill Structure:** It is time to say goodbye to the last remaining mill site buildings. The Village is currently accepting

bids for the selective demolition of the last remaining mill structures. Most of the building materials above grade will be removed. The lower portions of the structures will remain and be analyzed by structural engineers for the future transformation of mill to entertainment, commercial and residential. Midwest Expansion is teaming up with the Village to complete the demolition and final structure. Demolition is set to be complete mid-summer 2020, with future rehabilitation and construction in the years to follow.

**Papermill Estates:** Located at the corner of Main Street and Maes Avenue, this 49 lot planned unit development continues to grow! This development offers a relaxing carefree lifestyle. **Treaty Park:** The entrance to the Cedars redevelopment is complete! Treaty Park offers a new ADA accessible play structure, gazebo shade structure, historical artifacts from the mill site, over 140 new plantings and open green space. The grand opening occurred in early November and we welcome all to enjoy the historical features, open space, play structure and gathering space. A special thank you to our many community partners.

**The Roots:** Just east of Treaty Park is a new apartment and mixed-use commercial development. The Roots is a community development by Midwest Expansion that will relate to the riverfront Ebb, Flow and Oasis living concepts. This apartment complex has broken ground on five units. The first unit rentals will be available in the coming months.
