President's Point of View

Cooperation Extraordinaire -

Another display of why Kimberly Remains Special

On a Friday, July 8, a fire fueled by tons of paper raged in neighboring Combined Locks. Quickly, the dedicated volunteers of the Kimberly Fire Department responded with support of their firefighting sisters and brothers. In what would play out to be a more than 24 hour engagement, these brave and committed firefighters worked to keep the blaze from capturing a neighboring home and safely brought the fire under control. The effort has certainly been touted in the media as herculean, with incredible support from some 67 fire fighting agencies! The effort took more than firefighters with the blaze commanding millions of gallons of water to control. The Kimberly Water department, led by Jerry Verstegen, were busy monitoring pumps, water tower levels and coordinating water breaks created by the massive surge of water being delivered to the hydrants near the fire site. Coordinating with the fire crews on the scene and neighboring water users in Darboy, the water department worked to maintain water flows through the village in a touch and go situation. As the water supply was being taxed, the decision to bring in tankers to supply a steady and uninterrupted supply was made. The Sunset Park boat launch served as the station where a steady parade of tanker trucks rolled, filled and returned to the fire scene. Thumbs up and applause from residents encouraged the firefighters from as far away as Egg Harbor and Sheboygan Falls as they worked tirelessly in support of this impressive effort. To watch this orchestration was truly impressive and an instant reminder of how blessed we are to have an amazing team of firefighters who have built a bond of cooperation that reaches far beyond the boundaries of Kimberly and for that, we should all stand and applaud!

I want to share a big thank you for those who engaged in the strategic planning process which will guide the village board for the next 10-15 years. We had a remarkable response to the survey and participation in our public visioning session held in mid July. Members of the staff, boards and commissions have also engaged in the process in a passionate, caring manner. Our mission will always remain focused on safety, streets, sewers and self, yet it is the manner in which we deliver services, programming and a sense of community that will always need our attention in maintaining this community as a great place to live, learn, work and play.

Speaking of live, learn, work and play; my oh my, what an active summer! Library programs were full with the Storybook Garden adding a whole new learning experience. The summer concert series both the Community Band and the Sunday at the Amphitheater seeing great crowds. Special thanks to all that gave of their time in nurturing the many flower beds through the village and along Eisenhower Drive. Your efforts beautify the village and we are grateful. Volunteers teaming with a great professional staff within the community truly made the summer of '22 something special. Their collective work transformed us BACK to pre-covid days with a sense of engagement, purpose, play and fun.

All Village Offices, Departments and the James J. Siebers Memorial Library

will be closed on **Monday, September 5th** in observance of Labor Day. This holiday will have no effect on garbage collection. However, recycling pick up will be one day after your regularly scheduled day: Monday's route on Tuesday, Tuesday's route on Wednesday, Wednesday's route on Thursday and Thursday's route on Friday.

STREET DEPARTMENT

Leaf Pickup

Leaf pick up will begin around the second week in October and continue through November 18th, weather permitting. Place all leaves on the terrace for pickup.

- Rake leaves to the terrace, **NOT INTO THE STREET.**
- **DO NOT** put leaves in bags, leaves which are placed in bags or any container **WILL NOT** be picked up.
- **DO NOT** rake twigs or branches with the leaves. They will clog the vacuum.
- Please keep plastic and paper out of piles.

Please keep in mind that in the beginning of leaf pick up the volume of leaves is minimal. This means that you may see the trucks canvas the town more often. Later, when all the trees drop their leaves, the volume of leaves slows down the pickup times. In turn, this causes the trucks to take longer when canvassing the Village. For instance, when leaf pick up is at its prime, the truck may only pick up your leaves once in a two week period. Once the truck has been down your street, it may take them two weeks to return.

To keep residents informed of our progress and anticipated route for collection, the Village of Kimberly has created "Leaf Man" which you can follow on Facebook @villageofkimberlywi. Free Fall Yard Waste

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free fall yard waste pick up **ONLY** on the following day: **MONDAY, OCTOBER 10th** for residents **NORTH** of the tracks or **MONDAY, OCTOBER 17th** for residents **SOUTH** of the tracks. Yard waste consisting of garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18" in length) will be picked up. Yard Waste must be put in lawn and yard waste bags and not exceed 50lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the **FREE** fall yard waste pick up. Once a street has been picked up, they **WILL NOT** return! **NO GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES OR PLASTIC BAGS!**

Free Tire Pickup

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free tire pick up **ONLY** on the following day: **Wednesday, September 21st** for the entire village. This free tire pick up has been authorized by Outagamie County and the Village will not pick up tires at any other time. There is a limit of 4 tires per household, rims are acceptable, and tires cannot be larger than 18" passenger vehicle tires. (NO business generated tires)

Weekly Brush Pickup

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter **MUST** be called in by 2:00p.m. on **WEDNESDAY** for a Thursday pickup.

Kimberly Water Department Customer Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. beginning **September 12th-15th and September 19th-22nd.** The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to insure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.**

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.

Are You In Violation Of Ordinance 418-6B?

Time Of Placement For Collection Of Refuse

Many residents are in violation of placing **large items** or their **polycart** to the curb too soon or **not removing** the polycart from the terrace after pick up.

The Ordinance Reads As Follows:

Restriction on time of placement. All polycart containers for refuse and bulky waste shall be placed in collection locations by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection, but not before 5:00 p.m. on the evenings prior to the regular collection time. All polycart containers for refuse and garbage disposal shall be removed from the curbside collection point within 24 hours after the regular collection time.

Smoke Alarms and CO Detectors

We are coming up on that time of year again to change the batteries and check the dates on your detectors. This message is shared a lot, but we cannot emphasize enough how this simple task could save your life.

Close Before You Doze

Approximately half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., according to a 2017 joint report from the U.S. Fire Administration and the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Researchers with the UL FSRI found that during a fire's spread, closed-door rooms had average temperatures of less than 100 degrees Fahrenheit, while open-door rooms had average temperatures of over 1000 degrees Fahrenheit. Closing bedroom doors before you go to sleep is a simple task that can potentially save lives in the event of a fire. When you can't get out, the most important thing you can do is close that door between you and the fire.



Story Book Garden at the Kimberly Library is bursting with life this summer. We hope you stop by and watch the progress and maybe sample some of the edible, pesticide-free produce.

Growing in the garden this year is a collection of herbs, vegetables, and flowers. Fragrant herbs include basil, stevia, rosemary, thyme, and parsley. For vegetables, there are kohlrabi plants, Swiss chard, kale, eggplant, bell peppers, celery, spaghetti squash, and cucumbers. Sprinkled in the veggies are bright marigolds. These goodies are grown in raised beds and pots to make them more accessible to everyone.

Story Book Garden is brought to you by a community effort. A grant from the Community Foundation provided funds for building supplies and garden tools. Boy Scout Troop 44 built the raised garden beds. The Village of Kimberly provided the soil and picnic tables for adults and children to lounge by the garden. Robinson Florist & Greenhouses provided most of the plants. The marigolds were grown from seeds donated to the Kimberly Library by a patron. And the bell pepper plants were part of a pepper planting project at the Kimberly Library this spring.

All of these contributions came together to bring a vibrant and prosperous garden to the community. We are excited to watch it grow.

Strategic Planning with the Kimberly Public Library is in full swing. Keep your eyes open for opportunities this fall to engage in conversations about the best path forward for

library services in Kimberly. Feedback gathered from community members will be shared with the Library Board of Directors to guide their decisions for

internal strategic development over the course of the next few years. Election Information

Registering to vote online is easy, safe, and secure

If you have a valid Wisconsin Driver License or State ID card issued by the DMV you can register to vote online at myvote.wi.gov before October 19th. If you prefer to register in-person you can visit the Clerk's office up until 5:00pm on November 4th. You must always provide a Proof of Residence document showing your name and Kimberly address when registering to vote.



Request or Track your absentee ballot today! You don't have to head to the polling place on election day to vote. With absentee voting, you can vote in-person at the Clerk's office before Election Day or receive your ballot by mail and either mail in your completed ballot or return it in-person at the clerk's office or polling place. Already requested a ballot? You can track your request at myvote.wi.gov to see that it's approved, your ballot is sent, and returned to be counted.

Important Election Reminders

- * Election Day is Tuesday, November 8th (not the first Tuesday of the month!)
- * Do not place absentee ballots in the drop box. The voter must return the ballot by mail or personally to the Clerk.
- * Photo ID is required
