#### **President's POINT OF VIEW**

**Budget and Tax Time** 

As I write, the Packers are slumping as they transition with their new quarterback, the Makers have made it past the first test on the grid iron playoff challenge and the elected officials and staff are immersed in the process of generating a budget for operating the Village for 2024. Which entity has the toughest challenge is up for debate, however, balancing the needs and wants in a municipal budget is a unique challenge. Like everywhere, costs continue to rise in equipment, materials, utilities and especially health insurance. In our budgeting discussions, the elected officials work in concert with the department heads in prioritizing and balancing affordability for you and me, the taxpayers. While we are not to the finish line with the budget, the reality is that we will all see an increase to maintain the services we expect from the village, yet I assure you that no stone will be (or was) left unturned to create a lean and properly prioritized budget. Allow me to share some of the challenges we face in this process in an effort to help you understand where your tax dollars are being spent.

Safety, Streets, Sewers, and Self are areas of priority in the budget process with wages and health insurance leading the way in cost of providing service with dedicated and professional staff. In the 2024 budget, we are wrestling with a 14% increase in health insurance. We will fund the police department with more than 1.5 million dollars. We have budgeted for years to replace the main fire apparatus and will use added shared revenue from the state to bring home the significant purchase. We will spend more than \$150,000 to light the streets, nearly \$200,000 is needed for waste disposal and we will invest in the library to the tune of \$380,000 to provide programming and resources for continued learning in the village. To keep streets clear of snow and ice, we project the need to spend \$160,000, our cost for bus service availability will be \$85,000 and we will spend nearly a half million maintaining streets throughout the village. Add in operating the swim lake and providing recreation programs to keep folks active and engaged and the numbers grow quickly. With 2024 comes a presidential election and with it, nearly \$15,000 added costs more than a "normal" year!

Please know that the professional staff working on our behalf is constantly working to secure grants (successfully I add) and planning five years in advance to best manage the budget. We see great savings in our overall costs through their efforts.

In 2024 we will begin the process of replacing the 70-year-old municipal garage and offices. This investment is necessary as the village has grown and with that growth, there is need for more

equipment to maintain the community. The building has been remodeled several times and after years and years of use, it is no longer efficient and maneuvering equipment safely is a concern. This project will take more than a year to complete. The village's Street Department Operators will be working out of a leased space in Little Chute for heavy equipment maintenance and storage. Office services for parks and streets will be conducted at the Village Complex. There will be borrowing for this project and debt service is something we need to budget for as well. The village has maintained a stellar bond rating through consistently sound fiscal management which will keep the debt costs as low as possible.

So, as you receive your tax bill, I am hopeful this helps you in understanding what you are paying for. I encourage you to communicate questions or concerns with any elected official and I welcome anyone to our meetings on Monday evenings as we openly discuss the needs of the community. Every year in late September, most of October and the first week in November our discussions focus heavily in the budgeting process.

Enjoy the trails during the seasonal change, soon the snow will fly, the ice rink will be flooded, and the sled hill will be snow covered. I wish you and yours a joyous holiday and warmth this winter as the village board continues the work with staff in maintaining the village as a great place to live, learn, work and play.

## Holiday Schedule & Garbage Route Changes

#### **Thanksgiving Holiday**

All Village offices and departments will be **CLOSED** on **Thursday, November 23rd** and **Friday, November 24th** in observance of the Thanksgiving Holiday.

Thanksgiving week **EVERYONES** garbage day is **CHANGING** to one day prior to your normal pick-up day.

#### **Christmas Holiday**

All Village offices and departments will be **CLOSED** on **Monday, December 25th** and **Tuesday, December 26th.** 

Christmas week **EVERYONES** garbage and recycling is **CHANGING** to one day after your normal pick-up day.

#### New Year's Holiday

All Village offices and departments will be CLOSED on Monday, January 1, 2024.



#### **Are You Registered To Vote?**

- You must register to vote under your new address if you have moved since you last voted.
- You must register to vote under your new name if it has changed since you last voted.
- You must register to vote if it has been four years since you last voted.

You will need to show Proof of Residency that includes the full name with correct address. Commonly used documents are a WI Driver License, utility bill, paycheck stub, or bank statement.

#### **Interested In Running For Office?**

An election will be held in the Village of Kimberly on Tuesday, April 2, 2024 to elect three (3) Trustee positions and one (1) Village President. Candidate paperwork can be picked up in the Clerk's Office or downloaded from elections.wi.gov. Simply select the Candidates tab and the link "Getting on the Ballot." Papers must be submitted to the clerk's office by 5:00pm on Tuesday, January 2, 2024.



#### **Property Tax Payments**

The Clerk's Office will be closed December 25th, December 26th & January 1st for the Holidays.

Once again for your convenience, **CAPITAL CREDIT UNION**, Kimberly location ONLY, will collect taxes for the Village of Kimberly until January 31, 2024. ANY RESIDENT, not just members, can pay their taxes at the Capital location in Kimberly. They offer extended hours and easy drive-through access.

Please make sure checks are signed, written out to the Village of Kimberly, and for the correct amount. Credit Card payments accepted through the Outagamie County website.

#### **Elections 2024 - How You Can Help!**

One of the most rewarding ways to participate in the election process is to become an Election Inspector. Duties can include checking in voters on Badger Books, issuing ballots, registering voters, monitoring voting equipment or counting votes. Our team works split shifts on Election Days from 6:30am-2:00pm and 2:00pm- close (usually 9:00pm or later in the case of November elections). Training is provided and inspectors are paid \$10.00/hr.

#### To be a poll worker, a person must:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be 18 years old (except high school student poll workers)\*
- Be able to read and write fluently in the English language
- NOT be a candidate for any office to be voted on at the polling place at that election
- Be a qualified elector of the county where the polling place is located

Poll workers are appointed to two-year terms so you will be asked to make a minimum two-year commitment.

\* High School Students- you can also participate! You must be 16 or 17 years of age, enrolled in grades 9-12 in a public or private school, and have at least a 3.0 grade point average or equivalent. You are not required to commit to a two-year term.

## Garbage & Recycling Reminders for Winter and the Upcoming Holidays

- The days for Bulky, Non-Metal Collection were changed four years ago to Monday and Wednesday for the designated week each month. Please reference the 2024 Garbage and Recycling Calendar for the collection dates for your address. This change was made to assist in providing adequate staffing throughout the week for other duties.
- Polycarts CANNOT be placed in the road or on top of snow piles
- The polycart MUST be placed at ground level either on the terrace or in the driveway. Polycarts which are placed in the road for pick up, during winter months, are subject to be plowed over and damaged. Replacement of damaged carts are the responsibility of the property owner at the cost of \$73.50.
- The Village DOES NOT pick up overflow garbage. Excess garbage generated due to the holidays must be disposed of by the renter or property owner. This can be done by spreading your overflow garbage over a couple of week's collection, asking a neighbor if they have room in their polycart, or by hauling the overflow garbage to the landfill.

#### **Weekly Brush Pickup**

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter MUST be called in by 2:00 p.m. on WEDNESDAY for a Thursday pickup.

#### **Winter Driving**

- Remember to slow down and drive with extra caution during the winter season. Allow more time for your trips to school, work, and shopping.
- The Village will maintain the street pavement as best they can. This does not mean the pavement will be completely free of snow and ice.
- There will always be situations where snow and/or ice build-up will occur on our streets and intersections especially early in the morning or later in the evening.
- Allow extra room when following other vehicles, approach intersections with extra caution, and assume your vehicle will not stop as fast as it does on dry pavement.
- Remain at least 200 ft behind snow plows and spreaders.



#### **Snow Removal**

- Village ordinance 430-10 states that it is unlawful to shovel, blow, or plow snow onto or across Village streets or alleys. Citations will be issued to habitual offenders.
- Salt barrels placed at specific intersections are to be used for emergency use only. These salt barrels are not provided for residents for their own application. Salt for sidewalks and driveways should be purchased at local retail outlets.
- Corner lot owners are asked to keep a path open through the crosswalks, the Village crew will clear the remainder of snow as time permits.
- Anyone with a fire hydrant near his or her property is asked to help keep the snow cleared from around it. This will allow for quick response time if ever the fire department needs to access the hydrant.
- Snow must be cleared from the sidewalks within 24 hours after each snowfall. If ice builds up, it must be removed or treated with a melting agent. It is Village policy to address unshoveled sidewalks only when a complaint has been filed.

Village officials do not go out looking for sidewalks that need shoveling. No written or verbal notice will be given to violators per ordinance 430-10. Failure to comply will result in sidewalks being cleared by the Village and billed at a rate of \$75.00 per hour, plus equipment usage. A minimum of one hour will be charged to clear sidewalks.

## Snow Removal Notice To Property Owners In The Village Of Kimberly

Notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land that fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk in the Village of Kimberly, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin. The Village of Kimberly Code of Ordinances Ch. 430 -10, states that sidewalks are to be kept clear of all snow and ice, to a minimum of five (5) feet in width, within twenty-four (24) hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the sidewalk shall be sprinkled with material to accelerate melting or prevent slipping. Furthermore, no person shall in any way deposit any snow or ice onto any public street, alley, sidewalk, or public land dedicated to public use. No further written or verbal notice will be given to violators. Failure to comply will result in sidewalks being cleared by the Village and billed at a rate of \$75.00 per hour, plus equipment usage and an Administrative Fee of \$25.00. A minimum of one hour will be charged to clear sidewalks.

#### **Christmas Tree Disposal**

NEW this year, the Street Department will **ONLY** pick up trees on your garbage day the week of January 9 – 11th. Residents can also drop off at the yard waste site.

#### **Dog Licenses**

2024 dog licenses will be available at Village Clerk's Office by December 15th, 2023. Neutered and Spayed Licenses are \$7.00. Intact Male & Female Licenses are \$12.00. When applying for a dog license, owners must present the current rabies vaccination certificate. Failure to license your dog may result in a \$124.00 citation per dog, issued by FVMPD.

**REMINDER** keep your pets leashed, Ordinance 180 states it shall be unlawful for any person within the Village of Kimberly to own, harbor or keep any animal which has been determined to be a public nuisance or allow the animal to run at large in the Village.

180-6C All dogs, cats or other domestic animals shall be kept on a leash no longer than eight feet at all times when off the premises of its owner.

#### **Smoke & CO Detector Maintenance**

Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors. While checking the batteries, please inspect the manufacture date – if it is 5-7 years old, you should consider replacing it soon. Many people estimate their detectors are "a couple years old" and we find them to be over 8 years old in many cases. If your detector starts to chirp, it is a sign that something is wrong with it. Usually, the batteries need to be replaced or the detector has reached its service life. Remember, smoke detectors save lives! Civilian fire casualties are anywhere from 35%-69% lower when battery-powered or hard-wired smoke detectors are in good working order.

#### Do you work shiftwork or have daytime availability?

We are looking for firefighters and EMS members. Members of KF/R can specialize in fire, EMS, or both. No prior training necessary – training provided at no cost to the member.

#### Do you have a wood burning fireplace?

As the weather shifts, please take the time to have your chimney cleaned and inspected by a professional. Chimneys are the number one cause of fires involving wood-burning appliances. It is a simple item to maintain, and the consequences of not doing so can be catastrophic.

Also remember to never burn scrap wood or softwood in your fireplace or wood stoves.

#### **OVERNIGHT PARKING BAN**

Per village ordinance, from **December 1st to April 1st**, vehicles are not permitted to park along village streets between the hours of **2AM and 6AM**. Vehicle owners may request permission from the Fox Valley Metro Police Department to leave their vehicle parked on the village streets during this period. Additional information on the winter overnight parking restriction as well as the link to the online request portal can be found at www.fvmpd.org under the Overnight Parking tab. Requests are limited per address and acceptance is dependent on weather conditions.



It's been three years since the library's change of direction from a joint library to the one-and-only public library of the Village of Kimberly! Boy, have we grown! We've added services, programs, and staff over the years, and our use has increased because of it! The success of the library is due to the amazing support we've received from Village residents, community members, Village Board Members and employees, Library Board members, and the Friends of the Kimberly Library. Thank you all for supporting the library through use, advocacy, and funding.

Unfortunately, fast growth puts a strain on resources, especially when it comes to services that don't pull their own weight. The library board continuously monitors effectiveness and efficiencies of library services to offer the best value for tax dollars. As such, they've made a difficult decision to discontinue Hoopla service for circulating digital content. Hoopla's pay-per-use price model is problematic. As popularity soars, so do the prices, and that use cannot be reimbursed through funding formulas, making the service unsustainable in any realistic way. Therefore, as of January 1, 2024, Hoopla will no longer be provided by the Kimberly Public Library. The library will continue to participate in the statewide consortium to offer digital materials including ebooks, downloadable audiobooks and e-magazines through the Libby app.

Another change that will take place on January 1, 2024 is copy machine prices. Costs for making copies will increase from 10

cents for black and white copies to 25 cents, and color copies will raise in price to 50 cents per page. Fax prices will remain the same \$2 for the first page plus \$1 for each additional page.

Finally, the library is experiencing an influx of meeting room reservations. We've opened our doors to accommodate meeting groups that have been displaced from the senior center because of Village construction on the public works facility. Please be aware that there is competition for meeting room space, so when booking, please plan ahead and call early.

As you can see, the library has grown through a growth spurt that has made changes necessary in order to sustain core library services. One thing that will never change – the library's commitment to offering quality service with a friendly smile.
